### HB 2272 -4 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

### WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Directs the Department of Land Conservation and Development to study issues relating to the use of land and to report to an appropriate legislative committee by September 15, 2022. Sunsets December 31, 2022.

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued

#### **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

## **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

-4 Requires Lane County to approve a planning application for the development of a permanent recreational vehicle park or campground, provided that the development is located on specified lands and is conditioned upon the applicant demonstrating and agreeing to certain provisions and limitations. States that the county approval is not a land use decision. Provides that county application fees, charges, and assessments and building or specialty permit requirements remain intact. Sunsets January 2, 2024. Authorizes a local government to require a property owner submit a permit application for the approval or siting of a nonresidential use that was destroyed or interrupted by the 2020 wildfires only for the purpose of establishing such conditions are necessary to maintain participation in the National Flood Insurance Program. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

REVENUE: No revenue impact

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued
