

FISCAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

Measure: SB 129 - 1

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Measure Description:

Increases maximum allowed fee Teacher Standards and Practices Commission can impose for reinstatement of license that has been suspended or revoked for gross neglect of duty or gross unfitness.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (TSPC)

Summary of Fiscal Impact:

Costs related to the measure are indeterminate at this time - See explanatory analysis.

Summary of Expenditure Impact:

See analysis.

Analysis: This measure would give TSPC new authority to collect fees from educator preparation providers (EPP), and school and educational service districts. It would allow an administrative law judge to award the commission reasonable attorney fees and court costs. It would allow the Commission to impose civil penalties upon licensees that are subject to disciplinary action. It would increase the maximum TSPC could charge for a reinstatement.

The -1 Amendments move the operative date for fee and fine collection to January 1, 2022 and transfer the Ending Balance funds from the National Board Certification Fund to the TSPC General Account.

All fees and civil penalties will be established by administrative rule and are effective on January 1, 2022. Since those fees and penalties have not been set at this time the fiscal is indeterminate. One option brought forward by the agency would generate an estimated \$560,250 Other Funds for 2021-23 (18 months) with the largest share of the fees being paid by the education preparation providers.

The transfer of the remaining funds in the National Board Certification Fund is estimated to be \$1.4 million given the current balance of the Fund. With this transfer the program will terminate and a position will be eliminated. This will result in \$1.4 million in reduced Other Funds expenditure limitation which is included as part of HB 5035, the budget bill for the Commission.
