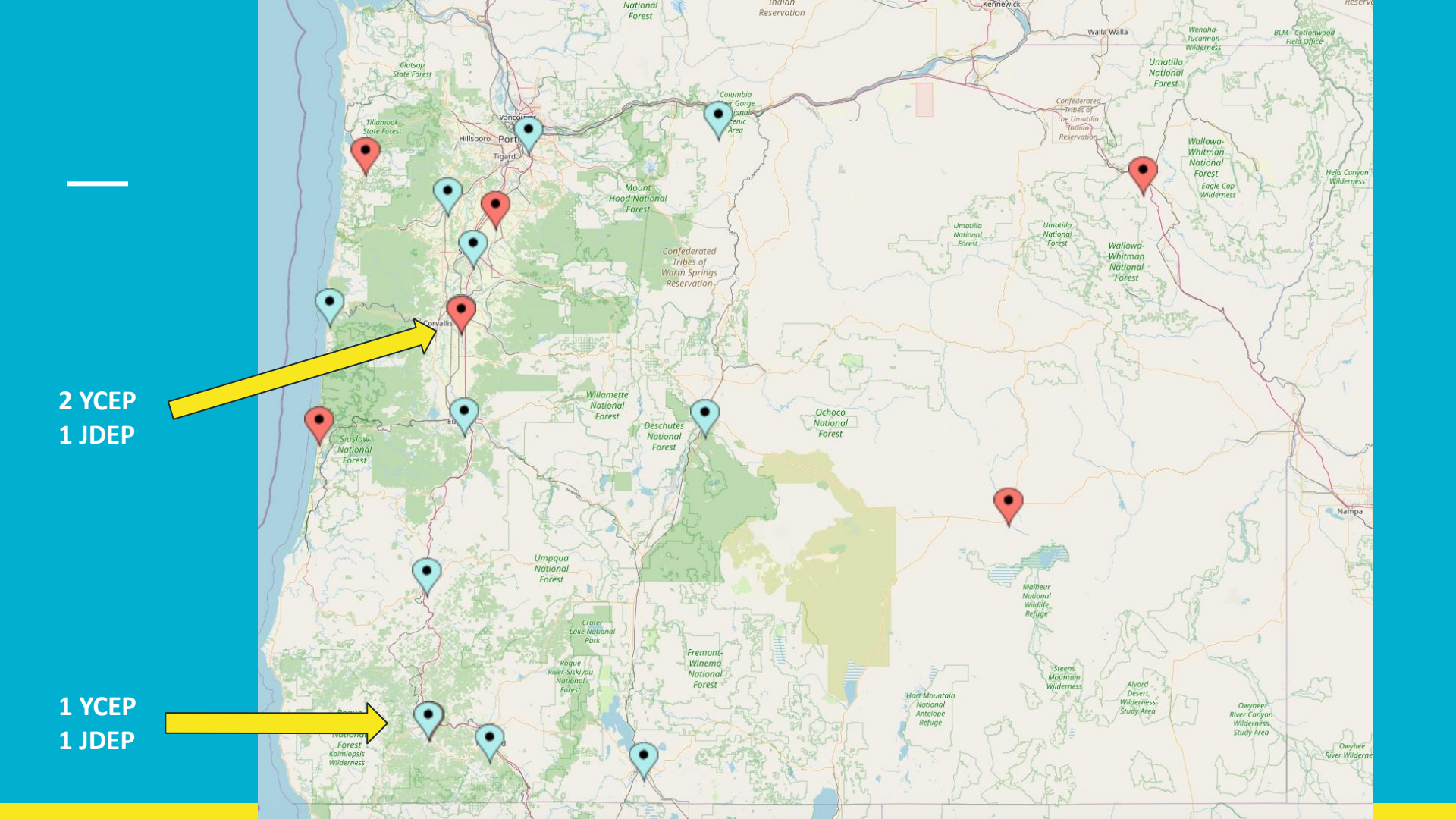


# Education Programs for Justice-Involved Youth

# Program Overview

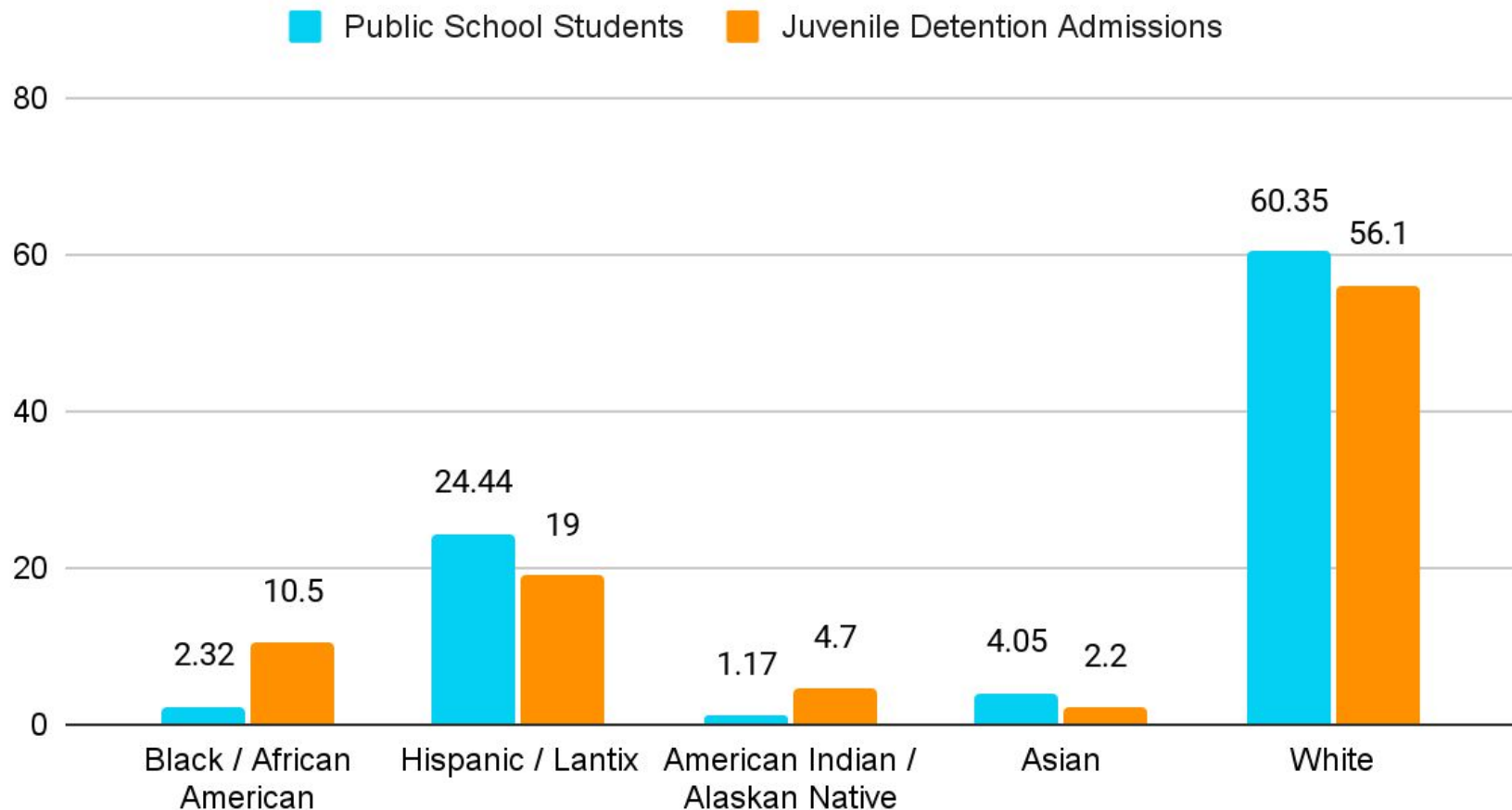
1. ODE contracts with school districts and ESDs to be local provider
2. Programs are funded out of State School Fund, on a statutory per-student basis
  - 1.5 ADMw for JDEP
  - 2.0 ADMw for YCEP
  - VS. up to 3.0 ADMw for students in traditional schools
3. School year is 220 days - 40 more than a traditional school averages (but no additional funding)
4. YCEP students typically have a longer stay, but in 2020 51 students were in JDEP for 90 days or longer

# Students Served

---

1. **1,753 total students in JDEP and 772 in YCEP over 19-20 school year**
2. **Students are disproportionately BIPOC**
3. **Students who qualify for Special Education are represented at a higher rate than in traditional schools (31% vs. 13-15% in most districts)**
4. **Many students have been disengaged from school prior to coming into JDEP (roughly 40% in metro area have not been in school for over a year)**
5. **Majority are in JDEP less than a month, but 51 students were held in county detention for over 3 months**
