Subject: HB 2575 – Relating to interactions with persons who have experienced trauma.
Work Session Recommendations

HB 2575 directs the Department of Justice (DOJ) to establish a program for awarding grants to law enforcement agencies and local governments to fund training for groups and agencies that interact with persons who have experienced trauma. Specifies agencies eligible for grants under program and directs DOJ to develop outcome measures to be used for evaluating grant program performance. Directs DOJ to develop model training program that takes into account effects of trauma and to develop best practices, in consultation with the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training, for law enforcement agencies when interacting with persons who have experienced trauma. Requires law enforcement agencies to adopt appropriate best practice policies by date specified by Department of Public Safety Standards and Training. Directs Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to review and update training consistent with DOJ model training program for law enforcement personnel in training academy. Appropriates moneys from General Fund to DOJ for purpose of awarding training grants. The measure takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A staff measure summary, fiscal impact statement, and revenue impact statement are available on the Oregon Legislative Information System (OLIS).

There is a -A4 amendment to the measure that includes a \$960,000 General Fund appropriation to DOJ for carrying out the purposes of the measure.

Recommended Changes

LFO recommends adoption of the -A4 amendment.

Final Subcommittee Action

LFO recommends that HB 2575, as amended by the -A4 amendment, to be moved to the Ways and Means Full Committee.
