 - Ensures Board expertise in considering environmental and habitat impacts
 - Prevents special interest influences from driving rulemaking
- 2. Addition of two non-voting members Provides a forum for intergovernmental collaboration and the sharing of expertise between OSMB and parterning agencies. Two ex officio nonvoting members will be appointed from:
 - Department of State Lands
 - Impacts on embankments and property held in the Public Trust
 - Department of Environmental Quality
 - o Turbidity levels exceeding state and federal clean water standards
 - National Marine Fisheries Service
 - Impacts to habitat and endangered species
- 3. Inclusion of the public in OSMB deliberations Improves communication with the public and increases transparency.

HB 2695A advances transparency and provides members of the public with an opportunity to engage with OSMB members in a meaningful exchange on the policy issues under consideration.
