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**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:**

Corrects references to, and specifies, "community developmental disabilities programs" across several statutory sections.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Correcting misalignment due to inadvertent errors in a previous bill, Senate Bill 20 (2019)

**EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:**

In 2019, the Legislative Assembly enacted Senate Bill 20 to make access to services more uniform for children and adults with developmental disabilities by refining a number of definitions, such as replacing the definition of "adult" with "individuals." A handful of incorrect internal references remain in some sections of the Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS), to a provision which requires an ongoing advisory role for persons with intellectual or developmental disabilities and their families, with respect to the program or support service brokerage that serves them (ORS 430.664). Instead, the internal reference should be to provisions concerning the establishment of local community developmental disabilities programs (ORS 430.620(1)(a) or (c)), consistent with Senate Bill 20.

Senate Bill 88 replaces several incorrect internal references to ORS 430.664 with ORS 430.620(1)(a) or (c).
