Measure Description:

Repeals statute authorizing law enforcement officers to command dispersal of unlawful assemblies and arrest participants who do not disperse.

Summary of Fiscal Impact:

Analysis:

The Oregon Military Department, Oregon State Police and the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training all report no fiscal impact from this measure.

Counties may see an indirect negative fiscal impact from House Bill 3059 as a result of law enforcement offices not being able to declare an unlawful assembly and trying to prevent liability by ordering a crowd to disperse. Therefore, the fiscal impact of House Bill 3059 on counties is indeterminate at this time.
