Measure Description:

Allows State Fish and Wildlife Commission to charge fees for hunting, angling and shellfish licenses, tags and permits that are less than amount established in statutory fee schedule.

Impact Explanation:

This measure removes the One Day Angling license and reduces the cost of the One-day Angling and Shellfish License from \$32.50 to \$23.00 starting in the year 2022. Changes in this license pricing structure will have an impact on revenue. Revenue impacts were calculated by examining the proportion of projected customers who will be spending less money to include the shellfish privilege in their angling trip. Since the price change would be implemented at January 1st of 2022, it will only affect 75% of the 2021-23 biennium, with a projected revenue decrease of \$241,279. Revenue impacts in the 2023-25 biennium will affect the entire biennium; however, this projected impact is small in proportion to overall projected license revenue.

ODFW expects no impacts from allowing the commission to charge less than statutory fee schedules. Because of the flexible nature of the ODFW commission, any changes to this fee schedule will not affect the overall agency revenue, where any negative impacts can be minimized and reverted by administrative rule changes.
