WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Corrects two references in state law to federal antipoverty programs administered through community action agencies, so they are consistent with federal language.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Provisions of measure

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Community action agencies are used to deliver federal antipoverty programs to individual recipients in each state. Currently, the governing statutory language in Oregon contains imprecise references to two of these federal programs: Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program and United States Department of Energy Weatherization Assistance Program.

Senate Bill 81 corrects two references to federal antipoverty programs delivered by community action agencies, from Low Income Energy Assistance Program and State Department of Energy Weatherization Program, to Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program and United States Department of Energy Weatherization Assistance Program, respectively.
