Measure Description:

Requires Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to establish by rule standards and procedures for licensing of private security entities.

Department of Public Safety Standards and Training (DPSST)

Analysis: This measure directs the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training (DPSST) to license businesses that employ private security providers and ensure competency of the providers by enforcing and ensuring employee rights. This will be a fee-based program and will be supported by certification, licensure, and renewal fees. There are approximately 1,600 business entities that would be covered by this measure.

DPSST would need one Compliance Specialist3 (1.00 FTE) and one Compliance Specialist 2 (1.00 FTE) to assists with investigations, enforcement, and administrative processes handling complaints and issues of noncompliance. One Office Specialist 2 (1.00 FTE) to assist with collection, processing, and storage of application materials for licensure.

This measure warrants a subsequent referral to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means for consideration of establishing a new program and its budgetary impact on DPSST.
