WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires that report of death for decedent who was homeless at time of death indicate that the decedent's residence address was "Domicile Unknown."

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Importance of data in addressing homelessness crisis
- Impact of homelessness
- Multnomah County's "Domicile Unknown" report

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

Clarifies that report of death indicate residence address for homeless decedents as "Domicile Unknown."

BACKGROUND:

Oregon State law requires a report of death to be completed for all deaths. Oregon Health Authority's Center for Health Statistics registers deaths that occur; it also collects information on Oregon resident deaths occurring out-of-state through an interstate exchange agreement.

Senate Bill 850 A requires that a report of death for a homeless decedent to indicate the decedent's residence address as "Domicile Unknown."
