Measure Description:

Specifies reasons for which the Oregon Liquor Control Commission may delay processing, approving or denying application for marijuana licensure. Clarifies that the Oregon Liquor Control Commission may revoke a marijuana retailer’s license for violations related to tax payments. Limits the number of marijuana seeds that a qualified marijuana producer may receive from any source in Oregon to no more than 200 seeds per month from all sources combined.

Analysis:
