**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:**

Adds assistant attorneys general whose duties include representing the Department of Human Services in child welfare matters to the list of eligible employees who may substitute their employer's address for their own on certain Department of Transportation vehicle or driver records.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Public employees with similar responsibilities having same protections or options
- Future comprehensive solution versus case-by-case changes

**EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:**

Under Oregon law, eligible public employees may request that driver or vehicle records maintained by the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) use their employer's address instead of their residential address. Current eligible employees include many public safety and law enforcement professionals.

Senate Bill 175 adds assistant attorneys general whose duties include representing the Department of Human Services in child welfare matters to the definition of "eligible employee," allowing the Department of Justice's address to be listed on certain ODOT records.
