CHAPTER

AN ACT

Relating to the Attorney General; and prescribing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) A public university listed in ORS 352.002 shall report annually to the Attorney General on the university's use of outside counsel for legal matters. The report must include:

(a) The types of matters handled by outside counsel;

(b) The number of litigation matters handled by outside counsel; and

(c) The total amount spent on outside counsel, categorized by type of matter.

(2) Reports under this section may be altered to protect the privacy of students and university employees and to comply with the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (20 U.S.C. 1232g), the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, the attorney-client privilege, or other state and federal confidentiality rules.

SECTION 2. (1) A public university listed in ORS 352.002 shall submit the first report required under section 1 of this 2021 Act no later than January 2, 2022.

(2) No later than July 1, 2024, the Attorney General shall report to an appropriate committee or interim committee of the Legislative Assembly on:

(a) The use of outside counsel by public universities listed in ORS 352.002; and

(b) A summary of the process for use of outside counsel at public universities in other states.

SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2021 Act is repealed on January 2, 2025.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2021 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2021 regular session of the Eighty-first Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.
