CHAPTER

AN ACT

Relating to health; amending ORS 414.766.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 414.766 is amended to read:

414.766. Notwithstanding ORS 414.065 and 414.690, a coordinated care organization must provide behavioral health services to its members that include but are not limited to all of the following:

(1) For a member who is experiencing a behavioral health crisis:

(a) A behavioral health assessment; and

(b) Services that are medically necessary to transition the member to a lower level of care;

(2) At least the minimum level of services that are medically necessary to treat a member's behavioral health condition as determined in a behavioral health assessment of the member or specified in the member's care plan; [and]

(3) Coordinated care and case management as defined by the Department of Consumer and Business Services by rule; and

(4) Mental health wellness appointments as prescribed by the Oregon Health Authority by rule.
