

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO B-ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL 3000

By JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

1 On page 14 of the printed B-engrossed bill, delete lines 9 through 24 and insert:

2 “**SECTION 16a.** (1) A person licensed under ORS 571.281 may, within the boundaries of
3 this state, transport to or receive from:

4 “(a) A person licensed under ORS 571.281 or a laboratory licensed under ORS 475B.560
5 industrial hemp or an industrial hemp commodity that contains no more
6 tetrahydrocannabinol than allowed by the State Department of Agriculture by rule if the
7 industrial hemp or industrial hemp used in the industrial hemp commodity originated from
8 a crop inspected under ORS 571.281 (7) that was found to not contain an average
9 tetrahydrocannabinol concentration exceeding the concentration specified by the department
10 by rule.

11 “(b) A person licensed under ORS 475B.090, 475B.100 or 475B.105 industrial hemp or an
12 industrial hemp commodity or product that contains no more tetrahydrocannabinol than al-
13 lowed by the Oregon Liquor Control Commission by rule if the industrial hemp or industrial
14 hemp used in the industrial hemp commodity or product originated from a crop inspected
15 under ORS 571.281 (7) that was found to not contain an average tetrahydrocannabinol con-
16 centration exceeding the concentration specified by the department by rule.

17 “(2) Industrial hemp or an industrial hemp commodity or product transported or received
18 as described in this section may not be considered a ‘marijuana item.’”.

19 On page 29, after line 14, insert:

“FISCAL PROVISIONS

23 “**SECTION 46.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
24 expenditures established by section 1 (2), chapter __, Oregon Laws 2021 (Enrolled House Bill
25 5018), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses
26 from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery
27 funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Liquor Control Commission for
28 marijuana regulation - recreational, is increased by \$399,007.

29 “**SECTION 47.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
30 ation made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (1), chapter __, Oregon Laws 2021
31 (Enrolled House Bill 5024), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, for health systems, health
32 policy and analytics, and public health, is increased by \$730,917.

33 “**SECTION 48.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
34 expenditures established by section 3, chapter __, Oregon Laws 2021 (Enrolled House Bill
35 5005), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses

1 **from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery**
2 **funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission,**
3 **is increased by \$3,000,000 for additional Illegal Marijuana Market Enforcement Grant Pro-**
4 **gram grants.”.**

5 In line 18, delete “45a” and insert “49”.

6 In line 32, delete “46” and insert “50”.

7 In line 38, delete “47” and insert “51”.
