

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3127

By SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON WILDFIRE RECOVERY

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after “recovery” insert “; and declaring an emergency”.

2 Delete lines 4 through 8 and insert:

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4 **“DEFINITION**

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6 **“SECTION 1.** As used in sections 2 to 35 of this 2021 Act, ‘local government’ has the
7 meaning given that term in ORS 174.116.

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9 **“WATER INFRASTRUCTURE**

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11 **“SECTION 2.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
12 \$105,000,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for
13 payment of expenses from lottery bond proceeds collected or received by the Department of
14 Environmental Quality for distribution to local governments and nonprofit organizations for
15 sewer, septic and other water infrastructure needs related to the 2020 wildfires or expendi-
16 ture by the department for such purposes.

17 **“SECTION 3.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
18 \$6,000,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for
19 payment of expenses from lottery bond proceeds collected or received by the Oregon Busi-
20 ness Development Department for distribution to local governments for sewer, septic and
21 other water infrastructure needs related to the 2020 wildfires.

22 **“SECTION 4.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
23 priated to the Oregon Business Development Department, for the biennium beginning July
24 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$5,525,000, for distribution to local govern-
25 ments for water infrastructure needs related to the 2020 wildfires.

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27 **“TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND UTILITY INFRASTRUCTURE**

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29 **“SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
30 \$13,000,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for
31 payment of expenses from lottery bond proceeds collected or received by the Oregon Busi-
32 ness Development Department for distribution to local governments for radio system, com-
33 munication and utility infrastructure needs related to the 2020 wildfires.

34 **“SECTION 6.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
35 priated to the Oregon Business Development Department, for the biennium beginning July

1 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$80,000, for distribution to Crawford Electric
2 for temporary power pole needs related to the 2020 wildfires.

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4 "FIRE AND PUBLIC SAFETY INFRASTRUCTURE

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6 "SECTION 7. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
7 priated to the State Fire Marshal, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General
8 Fund, the amount of \$19,100,000, for distribution to local governments for fire infrastructure
9 and acquiring or upgrading property with fire infrastructure related to the 2020 wildfires or
10 expenditure by the office of the State Fire Marshal for such purposes.

11 "SECTION 8. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
12 priated to the Department of State Police, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the
13 General Fund, the amount of \$1,200,000, for distribution to local governments for enhanced
14 public safety patrol needs related to the 2020 wildfires.

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16 "TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE

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18 "SECTION 9. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
19 \$7,500,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for
20 payment of expenses from the State Highway Fund collected or received by the Department
21 of Transportation for distribution to local governments for repair and replacement of trans-
22 portation infrastructure related to the 2020 wildfires.

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24 "REVENUE REPLACEMENT

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26 "SECTION 10. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
27 priated to the Department of Revenue, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the
28 General Fund, the amount of \$48,250,000, for deposit into the Lost Revenue Stabilization Fund
29 established under section 1, chapter __, Oregon Laws 2021 (Enrolled House Bill 3367).

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31 "EDUCATION

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33 "SECTION 11. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
34 priated to the Department of Education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the
35 General Fund, the amount of \$7,500,000, for deposit into the School Stabilization Fund es-
36 tablished under section 2, chapter __, Oregon Laws 2021 (Enrolled House Bill 3367).

37 "SECTION 12. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
38 priated to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for the biennium beginning July
39 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$5,650,000, for distribution to a community
40 college and a public university to support higher education and offset revenue losses related
41 to the 2020 wildfires.

43 "COST SHARE

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45 "SECTION 13. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-

1 **priated to the Department of Transportation, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out**
2 **of the General Fund, the amount of \$15,000,000, for hazardous waste and structural debris**
3 **cleanup cost sharing related to the 2020 wildfires.**

4 **“SECTION 14. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-**
5 **priated to the Department of Environmental Quality, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021,**
6 **out of the General Fund, the amount of \$3,000,000, for hazardous waste and structural debris**
7 **cleanup cost sharing related to the 2020 wildfires.**

8 **“SECTION 15. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-**
9 **priated to the Office of Emergency Management, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out**
10 **of the General Fund, the amount of \$50,000,000, for securing nonfederal cost sharing to lev-**
11 **erage Federal Emergency Management Agency Hazard Mitigation Funds related to the 2020**
12 **wildfires.**

13 **“SECTION 16. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-**
14 **priated to the State Fire Marshal, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General**
15 **Fund, the amount of \$5,000, for distribution to a rural fire protection district for cost sharing**
16 **with the Federal Emergency Management Agency related to the 2020 wildfires.**

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18 **“BUSINESS AND COMMERCIAL DISTRICTS**

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20 **“SECTION 17. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-**
21 **priated to the State Parks and Recreation Department, for the biennium beginning July 1,**
22 **2021, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$5,000,000, for providing grants through the**
23 **Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant Program to commercial districts impacted by the**
24 **2020 wildfires.**

26 **“STAFFING CAPACITY**

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28 **“SECTION 18. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-**
29 **priated to the Office of Emergency Management, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out**
30 **of the General Fund, the amount of \$3,250,000, for response and recovery staffing related to**
31 **the 2020 wildfires.**

32 **“SECTION 19. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-**
33 **priated to the Department of Land Conservation and Development, for the biennium begin-**
34 **ning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$400,000, for planning staff related**
35 **to the 2020 wildfires.**

36 **“SECTION 20. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-**
37 **priated to the Housing and Community Services Department, for the biennium beginning July**
38 **1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$_____, for the Community Development**
39 **Block Grant Disaster Recovery Program related to the 2020 wildfires.**

40 **“SECTION 21. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-**
41 **priated to the Oregon Business Development Department, for the biennium beginning July**
42 **1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$14,000,000, for distribution to local govern-**
43 **ments for staffing and materials reimbursement related to the 2020 wildfires.**

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45 **“HOUSING**

1 “**SECTION 22.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
2 \$350,000,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for
3 payment of expenses from lottery bond proceeds collected or received by the Housing and
4 Community Services Department for renovation, reconstruction and replacement of homes,
5 mobile homes and manufactured housing units, temporary rental and relocation assistance
6 and land acquisition for housing related to the 2020 wildfires.

7 “**SECTION 23.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
8 priated to the Housing and Community Services Department, for the biennium beginning July
9 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$60,000,000, for county housing development
10 and programs, housing subsidies and a bulk purchasing lumber revolving loan program to
11 assist with rebuilding related to the 2020 wildfires.

12 “**SECTION 24.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
13 priated to the Housing and Community Services Department, for the biennium beginning July
14 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$_____, for the Oregon Rebuilding
15 Oregon housing initiative related to the 2020 wildfires.

16 “**SECTION 25.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
17 priated to the Department of Human Services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out
18 of the General Fund, the amount of \$90,000,000, for feeding and sheltering survivors of the
19 2020 wildfires.

20 “**SECTION 26.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
21 priated to the Department of Consumer and Business Services, for the biennium beginning
22 July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$10,000,000, for a grant program to
23 incentivize residential and commercial fire hardening and resiliency for 2020 wildfire survi-
24 vors who are rebuilding and repairing dwellings and other structures that were destroyed
25 or damaged in the 2020 wildfires.

26 “**SECTION 27.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
27 priated to the State Department of Energy, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of
28 the General Fund, the amount of \$10,000,000, for a grant program to incentivize residential
29 and commercial energy efficiency for 2020 wildfire survivors who are rebuilding and repairing
30 dwellings and other structures that were destroyed or damaged in the 2020 wildfires.

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32 “NATURAL RESOURCES
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34 “**SECTION 28.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
35 \$41,000,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for
36 payment of expenses from lottery bond proceeds collected or received by the State Forestry
37 Department for stabilization projects, seeding for erosion control and invasive species con-
38 trol related to the 2020 wildfires.

39 “**SECTION 29.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
40 priated to the State Forestry Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the
41 General Fund, the amount of \$5,000,000, for developing tree seedling, nursery capacity and
42 tree supply for replanting in regions of this state impacted by the 2020 wildfires.

43 “**SECTION 30.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
44 \$6,500,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for
45 payment of expenses from lottery bond proceeds collected or received by the Department of

1 Environmental Quality for drinking water intake protections, repair and monitoring in re-
2 gions of this state impacted by the 2020 wildfires.

3 “SECTION 31. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
4 \$1,250,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for
5 payment of expenses from lottery bond proceeds collected or received by the State Depart-
6 ment of Geology and Mineral Industries for geotechnical analysis to assess risks of landslides
7 and debris flows in regions of this state impacted by the 2020 wildfires.

8 “SECTION 32. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
9 priated to the Department of Transportation, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out
10 of the General Fund, the amount of \$1,250,000, for developing tree seedling, nursery capacity
11 and tree supply for the assessment of cultural resources in advance of recovery actions in
12 regions of this state impacted by the 2020 wildfires.

13 “SECTION 33. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
14 priated to the State Marine Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the Gen-
15 eral Fund, the amount of \$2,000,000, for maintenance of navigable rivers impacted by the 2020
16 wildfires.

17 “SECTION 34. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
18 \$500,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for
19 payment of expenses from lottery bond proceeds collected or received by the Oregon
20 Watershed Enhancement Board for McKenzie watershed recovery, water quality monitoring
21 and geographic information system analysis related to the 2020 wildfires.

22 “SECTION 35. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
23 priated to the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board, for the biennium beginning July 1,
24 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$32,750,000, for environmental restoration,
25 protection and improvement, targeted acquisition of floodplain properties, in consultation
26 with tribal communities, and repair of recreational facilities related to the 2020 wildfires.

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28 “MISCELLANEOUS

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30 “SECTION 36. The unit captions used in this 2021 Act are provided only for the conven-
31 ience of the reader and do not become part of the statutory law of this state or express any
32 legislative intent in the enactment of this 2021 Act.

33 “SECTION 37. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
34 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect
35 July 1, 2021.”
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
