

House Bill 3403

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to repeal all permanent rules adopted by director in connection with addressing COVID-19 public health emergency in all Oregon workplaces.

Sunsets January 2, 2022.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

1
2 Relating to rules addressing coronavirus disease public health emergency in Oregon workplaces; and
3 declaring an emergency.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1. The Director of the Department of Consumer and Business Services shall**
6 **repeal all permanent rules adopted by the director in connection with addressing the**
7 **coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) public health emergency in all Oregon workplaces on**
8 **the date on which the declaration of a state of emergency issued by the Governor on March**
9 **8, 2020, and any extension of the declaration, is no longer in effect.**

10 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2021 Act is repealed on January 2, 2022.**

11 **SECTION 3. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
12 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect**
13 **on its passage.**
