

## HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 5042

By JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

1 Delete lines 4 through 15 of the printed bill and insert:

2 “**SECTION 1.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation  
3 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (4), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019,  
4 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for aging and people with disabilities and  
5 intellectual/developmental disabilities programs, is decreased by \$68,448,535.

6 “**SECTION 2.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation  
7 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (3), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019,  
8 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for child welfare, is decreased by \$1,855,725.

9 “**SECTION 3.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation  
10 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (1), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019,  
11 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for central services and state assessments and  
12 enterprise-wide costs, is increased by \$70,304,260 for food and shelter services related to  
13 wildfire recovery.

14 “**SECTION 4.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
15 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
16 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
17 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal  
18 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries  
19 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not  
20 described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the Depart-  
21 ment of Human Services, for central services and state assessments and enterprise-wide  
22 costs, is increased by \$68,687,837 to allow the agency to use federal reimbursement funds for  
23 wildfire-related food and shelter costs.

24 “**SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
25 expenditures established by section 3 (3), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
26 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,  
27 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or  
28 received by the Department of Human Services, for child welfare, is increased by \$1,855,725.

29 “**SECTION 6.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
30 expenditures established by section 3 (4), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
31 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,  
32 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or  
33 received by the Department of Human Services, for aging and people with disabilities and  
34 intellectual/developmental disabilities programs, is increased by \$74,162,847.

35 “**SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation

1 made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (1), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the  
2 biennium ending June 30, 2021, for Health Systems, Health Policy and Analytics, and Public  
3 Health, is increased by \$4,058,368 to rebalance the agency’s budget, repay federal Medicaid  
4 matching funds owed to the federal government, begin implementation of the Oregon  
5 Psilocybin Services Act and fund behavioral health investments related to ORS 161.370.

6 **“NOTE:** Section 8 was deleted. Subsequent sections were not renumbered.

7 **“SECTION 9.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation  
8 made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (3), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the  
9 biennium ending June 30, 2021, for central services, state assessments and enterprise-wide  
10 costs, is increased by \$1,844,075 to rebalance the agency’s budget.

11 **“SECTION 10.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
12 ation made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 7, chapter 560, Oregon Laws 2019, for  
13 the biennium ending June 30, 2021, is decreased by \$84,473 as part of a net-zero technical  
14 adjustment with the General Fund appropriation made to the Oregon Health Authority by  
15 section 1 (1), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for Health Systems, Health Policy and Analyt-  
16 ics, and Public Health.

17 **“SECTION 11.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
18 ation made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 11, chapter 629, Oregon Laws 2019, for  
19 the biennium ending June 30, 2021, is decreased by \$591,974 as part of a net-zero technical  
20 adjustment with the General Fund appropriation made to the Oregon Health Authority by  
21 section 1 (1), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for Health Systems, Health Policy and Analyt-  
22 ics, and Public Health.

23 **“SECTION 12.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
24 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
25 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
26 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, tobacco tax receipts, recreational  
27 marijuana tax receipts, provider taxes, Medicare receipts and federal funds for indirect cost  
28 recovery, Supplemental Security Income recoveries, Women, Infants and Children Program  
29 food rebates, the Coordinated School Health Program, the Edward Byrne Memorial State and  
30 Local Law Enforcement Assistance Grant Program and emergency preparedness and re-  
31 sponse services, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in section 2,  
32 chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the Oregon Health Authority, for  
33 Health Systems, Health Policy and Analytics, and Public Health, is increased by \$615,420,291  
34 to rebalance the agency’s budget and begin implementation of the Drug Addiction Treatment  
35 and Recovery Act.

37 **“SECTION 14.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
38 expenditures established by section 2 (3), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
39 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
40 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, tobacco tax receipts, recreational  
41 marijuana tax receipts, provider taxes, Medicare receipts and federal funds for indirect cost  
42 recovery, Supplemental Security Income recoveries, Women, Infants and Children Program  
43 food rebates, the Coordinated School Health Program, the Edward Byrne Memorial State and  
44 Local Law Enforcement Assistance Grant Program and emergency preparedness and re-  
45 sponse services, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in section 2,

1 chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the Oregon Health Authority, for  
2 central services, state assessments and enterprise-wide costs, is increased by \$29,293 to re-  
3 balance the agency's budget.

4 "SECTION 15. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
5 expenditures established by section 4 (1), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
6 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,  
7 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or  
8 received by the Oregon Health Authority, for Health Systems, Health Policy and Analytics,  
9 and Public Health, is decreased by \$129,961,710 as a result of net adjustments to rebalance  
10 the agency's budget and fund behavioral health investments related to ORS 161.370.

11 "NOTE: Section 16 was deleted. Subsequent sections were not renumbered.

12 "SECTION 17. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
13 expenditures established by section 4 (3), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
14 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,  
15 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or  
16 received by the Oregon Health Authority, for central services, state assessments and  
17 enterprise-wide costs, is increased by \$5,306,299 to rebalance the agency's budget.

18 "SECTION 18. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
19 ation made to the Department of Justice by section 1, chapter 608, Oregon Laws 2019, for the  
20 biennium ending June 30, 2021, for the payment of expenses of district attorneys, is increased  
21 by \$575,000 for reconciliation of personal services expenses.

22 "SECTION 19. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
23 ation made to the Public Defense Services Commission by section 1 (2), chapter 303, Oregon  
24 Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for professional services, is decreased by  
25 \$133,715 for a technical adjustment.

26 "SECTION 20. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
27 ation made to the Public Defense Services Commission by section 1 (3), chapter 303, Oregon  
28 Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for the Contract and Business Services  
29 Division, is increased by \$133,715 for a technical adjustment.

30 "SECTION 21. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
31 expenditures established by section 4, chapter 269, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium end-  
32 ing June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds other  
33 than those described in section 2, chapter 269, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the  
34 Employment Department, is decreased by \$30,000,000.

35 "SECTION 22. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
36 expenditures established by section 1 (1), chapter 269, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
37 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
38 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and moneys appropriated to the Employ-  
39 ment Department by sections 2 and 3, chapter 269, Oregon Laws 2019, but excluding lottery  
40 funds and federal funds other than those described in section 2, chapter 269, Oregon Laws  
41 2019, collected or received by the Employment Department, for unemployment insurance,  
42 shared services and workforce operations, and workforce and economic research, is in-  
43 creased by \$30,000,000 for payment of administrative expenses related to unemployment in-  
44 surance.

45 "SECTION 23. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on

1 expenditures established by section 4, chapter 642, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium end-  
2 ing June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds other  
3 than those described in sections 2 and 6, chapter 642, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received  
4 by the Housing and Community Services Department, is increased by \$526,951 to administer  
5 federal funding for rental assistance, energy assistance, homeless assistance and coronavirus  
6 relief programs.

7 **“SECTION 24.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
8 expenditures established by section 1 (1), chapter 694, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
9 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
10 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal  
11 funds, collected or received by the Oregon Liquor Control Commission, for administrative  
12 expenses, is increased by \$1,531,400 for payment of bank card fees.

13 **“SECTION 25.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
14 expenditures established by section 1 (4), chapter 694, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
15 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
16 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal  
17 funds, collected or received by the Oregon Liquor Control Commission, for agents’ compen-  
18 sation - all other, is increased by \$2,255,296 for retail store liquor agent compensation.

19 **“SECTION 26.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
20 expenditures established by section 1 (5), chapter 694, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
21 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
22 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal  
23 funds, collected or received by the Oregon Liquor Control Commission, for agents’ compen-  
24 sation - distillery agents, is increased by \$659,000 for distillery agents’ compensation.

25 **“SECTION 27.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of  
26 \$629,574 is established for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for pay-  
27 ment of expenses from fees, moneys, or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,  
28 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Real Estate  
29 Agency for increased testing costs.

30 **“SECTION 28.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
31 expenditures established by section 4 (1), chapter 452, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
32 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds other  
33 than those described in section 2, chapter 452, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the  
34 State Department of Agriculture, for administrative and support services, is increased by  
35 \$32,630 to shift limitation between program areas.

36 **“SECTION 29.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
37 expenditures established by section 4 (4), chapter 452, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
38 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds other  
39 than those described in section 2, chapter 452, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the  
40 State Department of Agriculture, for market access, is decreased by \$32,630 to shift limita-  
41 tion between program areas.

42 **“SECTION 30.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
43 ation made to the State Department of Energy by section 1, chapter 698, Oregon Laws 2019,  
44 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for debt service for the small scale local energy loan  
45 program, is decreased by \$4,334,048.

1       “**SECTION 31.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
2       ation made to the Legislative Assembly by section 6, chapter 693, Oregon Laws 2019, for the  
3       biennium ending June 30, 2021, for payment of the expenses of certain offices, is decreased  
4       by \$1,500,000.

5       “**SECTION 32.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
6       ation made to the Legislative Assembly by section 7 (1), chapter 693, Oregon Laws 2019, for  
7       the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for payment of the expenses of members of the Eightieth  
8       Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, is increased by \$100,000.

9       “**SECTION 33.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
10       ation made to the Legislative Assembly by section 7 (2), chapter 693, Oregon Laws 2019, for  
11       the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for payment of the expenses of members of the Eighty-  
12       first Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, is increased by \$1,400,000.

13       “**SECTION 34.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
14       ation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (1), chapter 688, Oregon Laws 2019,  
15       for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for operations and health services, is decreased by  
16       \$5,747,811.

17       “**SECTION 35.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
18       ation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (2), chapter 688, Oregon Laws 2019,  
19       for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for central administration and administrative services,  
20       is increased by \$10,593,586.

21       “**SECTION 36.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
22       ation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (3), chapter 688, Oregon Laws 2019,  
23       for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for offender management and rehabilitation, is de-  
24       creased by \$2,218,948.

25       “**SECTION 37.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
26       ation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (6), chapter 688, Oregon Laws 2019,  
27       for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for capital improvements, is decreased by \$2,626,827.

28       “**SECTION 38.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
29       expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 688, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
30       ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
31       other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal  
32       funds, collected or received by the Department of Corrections, for operations and health  
33       services, is increased by \$19,500,000 for federal reimbursement of COVID-19 expenses.

34       “**SECTION 39.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
35       expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 688, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
36       ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
37       other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal  
38       funds, collected or received by the Department of Corrections, for operations and health  
39       services, is increased by \$1,500,000 for federal reimbursement of expenses incurred during the  
40       2020 wildfire season.

41       “**SECTION 40.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
42       ation made to the Department of Justice by section 1 (5), chapter 692, Oregon Laws 2019, for  
43       the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for the defense of criminal convictions, is increased by  
44       \$550,000 for forecasted caseload expenses.

45       “**SECTION 41.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-

1 ation made to the Oregon Military Department by section 1 (4), chapter 534, Oregon Laws  
2 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for community support, is increased by \$229,608  
3 for state active duty expenses and to provide matching funds for reimbursable wildfire ex-  
4 penses.

5 “SECTION 42. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
6 ation made to the Oregon Military Department by section 1 (1), chapter 534, Oregon Laws  
7 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for administration, is increased by \$25,000 for  
8 interest expenses.

9 “SECTION 43. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
10 expenditures established by section 2 (4), chapter 534, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
11 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
12 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and reimbursements from federal service  
13 agreements, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter  
14 534, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the Oregon Military Department, for com-  
15 munity support, is increased by \$3,376,526 for federal reimbursement of expenses incurred  
16 during the 2020 wildfire season.

17 “SECTION 44. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
18 ation made to the Oregon Military Department by section 1 (3), chapter 534, Oregon Laws  
19 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for emergency management, is increased by  
20 \$584,456 to provide state matching funds for the Federal Emergency Management Agency’s  
21 Other Needs Assistance program.

22 “SECTION 45. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
23 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 479, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
24 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
25 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal  
26 funds, collected or received by the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training, for  
27 operations, is increased by \$1,503,520 to add three classes to the 2019-2021 training calendar.

28 “SECTION 46. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
29 ation made to the Public Defense Services Commission by section 1 (1), chapter 303, Oregon  
30 Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for the Appellate Division, is increased by  
31 \$1,000,000 for the payment of transcription and discovery services.

32 “SECTION 47. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
33 ation made to the Public Defense Services Commission by section 1 (2), chapter 303, Oregon  
34 Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for professional services, is increased by  
35 \$6,185,368 for increases in contracting costs and the Parent Child Representation Program.

36 “SECTION 48. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
37 ation made to the Public Defense Services Commission by section 1 (3), chapter 303, Oregon  
38 Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for the Contract and Business Services  
39 Division, is increased by \$353,854 for office equipment for the Multnomah County Courthouse.

40 “SECTION 49. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the limitation on expenditures  
41 established by section 71, chapter 9, Oregon Laws 2020 (second special session), for the  
42 biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal  
43 funds collected or received by the Department of Veterans’ Affairs, is increased by \$849,918  
44 for CARES Act Provider Relief Fund payments to the Oregon Veterans’ Homes.

45 “SECTION 50. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the limitation on expenditures

1 established by section 4, chapter 570, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30,  
2 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds collected or received  
3 by the Department of Veterans' Affairs, is increased by \$110,164 for the State Approving  
4 Agency program.

5 **"SECTION 51.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
6 expenditures established by section 2, chapter 669, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium end-  
7 ing June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other  
8 revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds,  
9 collected or received by the Department of Land Conservation and Development, is increased  
10 by \$150,901 for collaborative projects funding.

11 **"SECTION 52.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
12 expenditures established by the Emergency Board at its November 9, 2020, meeting (Item  
13 No. 3), for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses  
14 from moneys received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services from the Fed-  
15 eral Emergency Management Agency to pay for COVID-19 emergency response activities, is  
16 increased by \$54,465,305 for FEMA reimbursement of protective equipment purchases and  
17 2020 fire season costs.

18 **"SECTION 53.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
19 expenditures established by the Emergency Board at its January 8, 2021, meeting (Item No.  
20 16), for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses  
21 for reimbursement of costs incurred in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic from revenues  
22 received from the Coronavirus Relief Fund by the Oregon Department of Administrative  
23 Services, is increased by \$8,923,765 for agency-related COVID-19 expenses.

24 **"SECTION 54.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
25 ation made to the Department of Revenue by section 1 (5), chapter 612, Oregon Laws 2019,  
26 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for the Corporate Division, is decreased by \$108,398  
27 for a technical adjustment.

28 **"SECTION 55.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
29 expenditures established by section 2 (6), chapter 612, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
30 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
31 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and reimbursements from federal service  
32 agreements, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter  
33 612, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the Department of Revenue, for the Corpo-  
34 rate Division, is increased by \$108,398 for a technical adjustment.

35 **"SECTION 56.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
36 expenditures established by section 323 (1), chapter 9, Oregon Laws 2020 (second special ses-  
37 sion), for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of grants-  
38 in-aid, program costs and purchased services from federal funds, other than those described  
39 in sections 8 and 10, chapter 609, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the Department  
40 of Education, for K-12 programs, is increased by \$4,109,313 for assistance from funds received  
41 through the federal Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund to address the impacts  
42 that COVID-19 has had and will have on eligible nonpublic school students and teachers  
43 through grants, contracts and other assistance.

44 **"SECTION 57.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
45 expenditures established by section 8 (1), chapter 609, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium

1 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,  
2 other than those described in sections 9 and 10, chapter 609, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or  
3 received by the Department of Education, for operations, is increased by \$117,872 for the  
4 administration and oversight of the funding for eligible non-public school students and  
5 teachers funded through the federal Governor’s Emergency Education Relief Fund.

6 “SECTION 58. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
7 expenditures established by section 323 (2), chapter 9, Oregon Laws 2020 (second special ses-  
8 sion), for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of grants-  
9 in-aid, program costs and purchased services from federal funds, other than those described  
10 in sections 8 and 10, chapter 609, Oregon Laws 2019, received by the Department of Educa-  
11 tion, for early learning programs, is increased by \$22,000,000 for assistance to child care  
12 providers.

13 “SECTION 59. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
14 ation made to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission by section 1 (1), chapter 666,  
15 Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for Higher Education Coordinating  
16 Commission operations, is increased by \$4,980,000 for funding of positions and other costs for  
17 the operations of the agency.

18 “SECTION 60. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
19 ation made to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission by section 1 (3), chapter 666,  
20 Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for the Community College Support  
21 Fund for distribution to community colleges and community college service districts, is in-  
22 creased by \$542,033 for payment to Blue Mountain Community College for education services  
23 to adults in custody in Department of Corrections facilities.

24 “SECTION 61. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
25 expenditures established by section 4 (2), chapter 522, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
26 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds  
27 collected or received by the Oregon Business Development Department, for infrastructure,  
28 is increased by \$7,923,907 for the expenditure of Community Development Block Grant fund-  
29 ing for emergency rental assistance and micro-enterprise assistance.

30 “SECTION 62. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
31 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 522, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
32 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
33 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal  
34 funds, collected or received by the Oregon Business Development Department, for business,  
35 innovation and trade, is increased by \$1,500,000 for funding from the Coronavirus Relief Fund  
36 received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and transferred to the  
37 Oregon Business Development Department for agency costs related to the COVID-19  
38 pandemic.

39 “SECTION 63. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
40 expenditures established by section 4 (1), chapter 522, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
41 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds  
42 collected or received by the Oregon Business Development Department, for business, inno-  
43 vation and trade, is increased by \$439,040 for the creation of an economic recovery plan and  
44 business adaptation strategies to assist Oregon businesses disrupted by COVID-19.

45 “SECTION 64. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the expenditure



1 limitation established by the Emergency Board at its June 5, 2020, meeting (Item No. 11), for  
2 the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the  
3 Oregon Business Development Department from funding from the Coronavirus Relief Fund  
4 received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and transferred to the  
5 Oregon Business Development Department, for business, innovation and trade, for a grant  
6 program for stabilizing rural Type A and Type B Hospital operations, is decreased by  
7 \$15,200,000.

8 “SECTION 65. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the expenditure  
9 limitation established by the Emergency Board at its June 5, 2020, meeting (Item No. 12), for  
10 the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the  
11 Oregon Business Development Department from funding from the Coronavirus Relief Fund  
12 received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and transferred to the  
13 Oregon Business Development Department, for business, innovation and trade, to provide  
14 personal protective equipment for small businesses, is increased by \$4,000,000.

15 “SECTION 66. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of  
16 \$9,200,000 is established for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for  
17 payment of expenses by the Oregon Business Development Department from funding from  
18 the Coronavirus Relief Fund received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services  
19 and transferred to the Oregon Business Development Department, for a commercial rent  
20 relief program.

21 “SECTION 67. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the expenditure  
22 limitation established by the Emergency Board at its June 5, 2020, meeting (Item No. 10), for  
23 the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the  
24 Oregon Business Development Department from funding from the Coronavirus Relief Fund  
25 received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and transferred to the  
26 Oregon Business Development Department, for business, innovation and trade, for technical  
27 assistance to minority- and woman-owned businesses affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, is  
28 increased by \$2,000,000.

29 “SECTION 68. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the expenditure  
30 limitation established by the Emergency Board at its July 14, 2020, meeting (Item No. 4), for  
31 the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the  
32 Department of Consumer and Business Services from funding from the Coronavirus Relief  
33 Fund received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and transferred to the  
34 Department of Consumer and Business Services, to establish a Quarantine Time Loss pro-  
35 gram, is increased by \$5,000,000.

36 “SECTION 69. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
37 expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 664, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
38 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
39 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and including federal funds from the United  
40 States Forest Service for fire protection and for research projects, but excluding lottery  
41 funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 664, Oregon Laws 2019, collected  
42 or received by the State Forestry Department, for fire protection, is increased by \$14,193,563  
43 for the processing of payments associated with emergency firefighting costs of the 2016  
44 through 2019 forest fire seasons.

45 “SECTION 70. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on

1 expenditures established by section 1 (3), chapter 454, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
2 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
3 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds, federal funds  
4 and funds described in section 2, chapter 454, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the  
5 Department of State Lands, for South Slough National Estuarine Research Reserve oper-  
6 ations, is increased by \$200,000.

7 “SECTION 71. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
8 expenditures established by section 3 (1), chapter 454, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
9 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds  
10 collected or received by the Department of State Lands, for South Slough National Estuarine  
11 Research Reserve operations, is decreased by \$200,000.

12 “SECTION 72. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
13 expenditures established by section 2, chapter 521, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium end-  
14 ing June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other  
15 revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, and including federal Older Americans Act funds  
16 received from the Department of Human Services, but excluding lottery funds and federal  
17 funds not described in section 2, chapter 521, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the  
18 Long Term Care Ombudsman, is increased by \$6,000 to allow the agency to use donations  
19 received in support of the Oregon Public Guardian and Conservator program.

20 “SECTION 73. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
21 expenditures established by section 3 (2), chapter 534, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium  
22 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,  
23 other than those described in section 2, chapter 534, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received  
24 by the Oregon Military Department, for emergency management, is increased by \$605,300,000  
25 for receipt and distribution of funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

26 “SECTION 74. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
27 ation made to the Department of State Police by section 1 (1), chapter 568, Oregon Laws 2019,  
28 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for patrol services, criminal investigations, gaming  
29 enforcement and office of the State Fire Marshal, is increased by \$1,500,000 for the Wildland  
30 Urban Interface Assistance grant program.

31 “SECTION 75. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-  
32 priated to the State Forestry Department, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, out of the  
33 General Fund, the amount of \$1,500,000 for a county communications infrastructure grant  
34 program.

35 “SECTION 76. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-  
36 priated to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for the biennium ending June  
37 30, 2021, out of the General Fund, the following amounts, for grants to mitigate impacts from  
38 the 2020 wildfires:

42 for summer enrichment programs for students in kindergarten to grade 12 and to provide  
43 parent-child summer programming for children up to age five.

44 “SECTION 90. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
45 expenditures established by section 323 (2), chapter 9, Oregon Laws 2020 (second special ses-

1 sion), for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of grants-  
2 in-aid, program costs and purchased services from federal funds, other than those described  
3 in sections 8 and 10, chapter 609, Oregon Laws 2019, received by the Department of Educa-  
4 tion, for early learning programs, is increased by \$5,301,806 for child care and early learning  
5 programs.

6 **“SECTION 91.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-  
7 priated to the Department of Education, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, out of the  
8 General Fund, the amount of \$500,386 for the staffing and other administrative costs of im-  
9 plementing and administering the Summer Learning and Child Care program.

10 **“SECTION 92.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-  
11 priated to the Department of Education, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, out of the  
12 General Fund, the amount of \$3,000,000 to continue early learning programs during the  
13 summer months.

14 **“SECTION 93.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
15 ation made to the Department of Environmental Quality by section 1 (2), chapter 663, Oregon  
16 Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for water quality, is increased by \$94,335  
17 for staffing and equipment related to testing for cyanotoxins caused by harmful algal blooms.

18 **“SECTION 94.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
19 ation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (2), chapter 668, Oregon Laws  
20 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for self-sufficiency and vocational rehabilitation  
21 services, is increased by \$2,900,000 for distribution to the Oregon Food Bank for emergency  
22 food purchases.

23 **“SECTION 95.** This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public  
24 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect  
25 on its passage.”.

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
