

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 5043

By JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

1 Delete lines 4 through 15 of the printed bill and insert:

2 “**SECTION 1.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
3 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (1), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019,
4 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for central services and state assessments and
5 enterprise-wide costs, is increased by \$9,861,413.

6 “**SECTION 2.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
7 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (2), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019,
8 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for self-sufficiency and vocational rehabilitation ser-
9 vices, is decreased by \$5,190,224.

10 “**SECTION 3.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
11 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (3), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019,
12 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for child welfare, is decreased by \$36,477,331.

13 “**SECTION 4.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
14 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (4), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019,
15 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for aging and people with disabilities and
16 intellectual/developmental disabilities programs, is increased by \$10,814,946.

17 “**SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
18 expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium
19 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
20 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
21 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
22 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
23 described in this section, collected or received by the Department of Human Services, for
24 self-sufficiency and vocational rehabilitation services, is decreased by \$946,229.

25 “**SECTION 6.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
26 expenditures established by section 2 (3), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium
27 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
28 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
29 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
30 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
31 described in this section, collected or received by the Department of Human Services, for
32 child welfare, is decreased by \$5,817,188.

33 “**SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
34 expenditures established by section 2 (5), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium
35 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or

1 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
2 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
3 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
4 described in this section, collected or received by the Department of Human Services, for
5 shared services, is increased by \$1,451,699 to allow the department to purchase document
6 scanners.

7 “SECTION 8. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
8 expenditures established by section 3 (1), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium
9 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
10 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or
11 received by the Department of Human Services, for central services and state assessments
12 and enterprise-wide costs, is increased by \$2,041,080.

13 “SECTION 9. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
14 expenditures established by section 3 (2), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium
15 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
16 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or
17 received by the Department of Human Services, for self-sufficiency and vocational rehabili-
18 tation, is decreased by \$15,137,677.

19 “SECTION 10. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
20 expenditures established by section 3 (3), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium
21 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
22 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or
23 received by the Department of Human Services, for child welfare, is decreased by \$22,973,174.

24 “SECTION 11. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
25 expenditures established by section 3 (4), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium
26 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
27 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or
28 received by the Department of Human Services, for aging and people with disabilities and
29 intellectual/developmental disabilities programs, is increased by \$21,300,076.

30 “SECTION 12. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
31 ation made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (1), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019,
32 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for Health Systems, Health Policy and Analytics, and
33 Public Health, is decreased by \$185,481,431.

34 “SECTION 13. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
35 ation made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (2), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019,
36 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for the Oregon State Hospital, is increased by
37 \$10,157,168.

38 “SECTION 14. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
39 ation made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (5), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019,
40 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for debt service, is decreased by \$1,934,265.

41 “SECTION 15. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
42 ation made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 7, chapter 560, Oregon Laws 2019, for
43 the biennium ending June 30, 2021, is decreased by \$190,000.

44 “SECTION 16. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
45 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium

1 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
2 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, tobacco tax receipts, recreational
3 marijuana tax receipts, provider taxes, Medicare receipts and federal funds for indirect cost
4 recovery, Supplemental Security Income recoveries, Women, Infants and Children Program
5 food rebates, the Coordinated School Health Program, the Edward Byrne Memorial State and
6 Local Law Enforcement Assistance Grant Program and emergency preparedness and re-
7 sponse services, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in section 2,
8 chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the Oregon Health Authority, for
9 Health Systems, Health Policy and Analytics, and Public Health, is decreased by \$5,807,409.

10 **“SECTION 17.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
11 expenditures established by section 4 (1), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium
12 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
13 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or
14 received by the Oregon Health Authority, for Health Systems, Health Policy and Analytics,
15 and Public Health, is increased by \$167,321,358.

16 **“SECTION 18.** This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
17 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect
18 on its passage.”.

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
