

## SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 5506

2 Education Coordinating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds from state bonds issued  
3 for the benefit of a public university, pursuant to agreements between the commission and  
4 a public university.

5 “**SECTION 4.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of  
6 \$56,496,994 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit  
7 for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Re-  
8 ceipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Higher  
9 Education Coordinating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds from state bonds issued  
10 for the benefit of a community college, pursuant to agreements between the commission and  
11 a community college.

12 “**SECTION 5.** The project approvals and expenditure limitations in sections 1, 2, 3 and 4  
13 of this 2021 Act and the expenditure limitations established by the Emergency Board during  
14 the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, for capital construction or acquisition projects, expire  
15 on June 30, 2027, unless otherwise noted.

39 **\$23,360,000** is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2019, as the maximum limit for

40 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but

41 excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Higher Education Coordi-

42 nating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds from state bonds issued for the benefit of a com-

43 munity college, pursuant to agreements between the commission and a community college.

44 “SECTION 9. Section 4, chapter 747, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to read:

45 “Sec. 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of [*\$101,397,241*]

1 **\$72,400,247** is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for  
2 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and  
3 reimbursements from federal service agreements, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not  
4 described in this section, collected or received by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission,  
5 for expenditures of proceeds from state bonds issued for the benefit of a community college, pursuant  
6 to agreements between the commission and a community college.

7 **“SECTION 10. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, and in lieu of the**  
8 **limitation on expenditures established at the December 14, 2018, Emergency Board meeting**  
9 **(Item No. 25), as increased at the September 25, 2020, Emergency Board meeting (Item No.**  
10 **33), the amount of \$25,000,000 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2017, as**  
11 **the maximum limit for payment of expenses for the Camp Umatilla Regional Training Insti-**  
12 **tute Re-Set project from federal funds collected or received by the Oregon Military Depart-**  
13 **ment.**

14 **“SECTION 11. The Legislative Assembly approves the proposal of the Oregon Military**  
15 **Department, submitted in accordance with ORS 396.515 (4), for the sale of the Lebanon Ar-**  
16 **mory and Lebanon Organizational Maintenance Shop.**

17 **“SECTION 12. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
18 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect**  
19 **July 1, 2021.”.**

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
