Senate Bill 602

Sponsored by Senator FREDERICK (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Removes sunset on requirement that students must receive certain information related to statewide summative assessments.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT Relating to statewide summative assessments; amending ORS 329.479; repealing section 6, chapter

519, Oregon Laws 2015; and declaring an emergency. 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

SECTION 1. Section 6, chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2015, is repealed. $\mathbf{5}$

SECTION 2. ORS 329.479, as amended by section 5, chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2015, is amended 6 7 to read:

8 329.479. (1) This section shall be known and may be cited as the Student Assessment Bill of 9 Rights.

(2) As used in this section: 10

(a) "Adult student" means a student of a public school or a public charter school who is 18 11 12 years of age or older or who is emancipated pursuant to ORS 419B.550 to 419B.558.

(b) "Parent" means a parent, legal guardian or person in parental relationship, as defined in 13ORS 339.133, of a student of a public school or a public charter school. 14

(c) "Statewide summative assessment" means a standardized summative assessment that is 15 identified by the Department of Education for administration in all of the school districts and public 16 17charter schools of this state.

(3) A parent or an adult student may annually choose to excuse the student from taking 18 19 a statewide summative assessment by:

20 (a) Completing a form established by the Department of Education as provided by sub-21section (4) of this section; and

22(b) Submitting the completed form to the school district for the school that the student 23attends.

(4) The Department of Education shall establish a form to excuse a student from taking 24a statewide summative assessment. The form must have at least the following: 25

26 (a) An explanation of the right of a parent or an adult student to excuse the student from taking a statewide summative assessment; and 27

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(b) An explanation of the purpose and value of statewide summative assessments.

[(3)] (5) At the beginning of each school year, each school district and public charter school 29 30 shall ensure that parents and adult students are provided with a notice about statewide summative 31 assessments. The notice shall be established by the Department of Education and must include inSB 602

1 formation about statewide summative assessments, the time frame when the statewide summative

2 assessments most likely will be administered and a student's or parent's right to excuse the student

3 from taking the statewide summative assessments.

4 [(4)(a)] (6)(a) At least 30 days prior to the administration of statewide summative assessments, 5 a school district or public charter school must send to parents and adult students a notice about the 6 statewide summative assessments. The notice must include:

(A) The purpose of the assessments and how the results of the assessments will be used;

8 (B) The specific days the statewide summative assessments will be administered;

9 (C) The amount of class time required for the statewide summative assessments;

10 (D) The learning targets that make up the assessments;

11 (E) The difference between good and poor performances on the assessments; [and]

12 (F) When results of the assessments will be available to students[.]; and

13 (G) Access to the form established as provided by subsection (4) of this section.

(b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this subsection, the Department of Education may waive the notice requirement for a school district or public charter school if a human-created disaster or a natural disaster affects the ability of the school district or public charter school to administer the statewide summative assessments and the statewide summative assessments must be provided at a later date.

[(5)] (7) School districts and public charter schools shall provide supervised study time for students excused from the statewide summative assessments as provided by this section. The study time shall be considered instructional time for purposes of rules adopted by the State Board of Education. [(6)] (8) A student who is excused from the statewide summative assessments may not be denied

a diploma under ORS 329.451 if the student is able to satisfy all other requirements for the diploma
established under ORS 329.451.

[(7)] (9) The results of a statewide summative assessment must be provided to students in a timely manner and in a manner that is understandable by the student.

[(8)] (10) If the rating on a school performance report is affected by the number of parents and adult students who excuse students from taking a statewide summative assessment as provided by this section, the Department of Education shall include on the school performance report:

30 (a) An indication that the rating was affected by a federal law requirement;

31 (b) A brief explanation of the federal law requirement that affected the rating; and

32 (c) The rating the school would have received if not for the federal law requirement.

33 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 34 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect 35 on its passage.

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
