Senate Bill 674

Sponsored by Senator HEARD (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to investigate best practices and latest technology and to establish hospital procedures to enable family members to visit hospitalized patients during pandemic.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to hospital visitation during a pandemic; and declaring an emergency.

3 Whereas in the wake of COVID-19, family members who were hospitalized were kept in isolation

4 and some never returned home or saw a loved one again; and

5 Whereas being unable to see a loved one who is hospitalized or near death compounds the 6 family's tragedy; and

7 Whereas if Oregonians have the right to die with dignity, then Oregonians should also have the

8 right to never die alone; now, therefore,

9 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

10 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall investigate best practices in the hos-11 pital industry and the latest sanitation technology available to enable family members to visit 12 patients who are hospitalized for treatment of an infectious disease or who are hospitalized 13 during a pandemic for reasons other than treatment of an infectious disease. Based on the 14 investigation, the authority shall establish procedures for hospitals licensed in this state to 15 permit members of a patient's immediate family to safely visit the patient in the hospital 16 during a pandemic.

17 (2) The procedures developed under subsection (1) of this section may not impose un-18 reasonable burdens on hospital staff or family members and may include a requirement for 19 quarantine before or after a visit.

20 <u>SECTION 2.</u> No later than September 15, 2022, the Oregon Health Authority shall report 21 the findings of its investigation and the procedures established under section 1 of this 2021 22 Act, in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, to the Joint Special Committee on Coronavirus 23 Response or the interim committee of the Senate related to health care, whichever com-24 mittee is in existence on the date of the report.

25 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 26 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect 27 on its passage.

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
