Senate Concurrent Resolution 13

Sponsored by Senator HEARD (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes limits on number of legislative measures that may be introduced for 2022 regular session. Establishes limits on number of legislative measures that may be presession filed for 2023 regular session.

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

3 (1) This rule constitutes a rule of proceeding of the Senate and the House of Representatives 4 of the Eighty-first Legislative Assembly. This rule supersedes any conflicting rule of either the 5 Senate or the House of Representatives, or any conflicting concurrent resolution that was adopted 6 prior to the adoption of this resolution.

7 (2) For the 2022 regular session, the following limits shall apply to the introduction of legislative 8 measures:

9 (a) A member of the House of Representatives may not introduce more than one legislative 10 measure.

11 (b) A member of the Senate may not introduce more than two legislative measures.

(c) A committee of the Senate, a committee of the House of Representatives or a joint committee
 may not introduce more than three legislative measures.

(d) The Senate President and the Speaker of the House of Representatives may each introduce
no more than one legislative measure in addition to the legislative measures described in paragraph
(a) or (b) of this subsection.

(3) For presession filing of legislative measures for the 2023 regular session, the following limitsshall apply:

(a) A member of the House of Representatives may not presession file more than eight legisla-tive measures.

21 (b) A member of the Senate may not presession file more than 12 legislative measures.

(c) A committee of the Senate, a committee of the House of Representatives or a joint committee
 may not presession file more than five legislative measures.

(d) The Senate President and the Speaker of the House of Representatives may each presession
file no more than 10 legislative measures in addition to the legislative measures described in paragraph (a) or (b) of this subsection.
