SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to provide that member of Legislative Assembly who, without permission or excuse, does not attend 10 or more scheduled legislative floor sessions of Legislative Assembly is deemed to be engaging in disorderly behavior and is disqualified from holding office as Senator or Representative for term following member's current term of office. Refers proposed amendment to voters for their approval or rejection at next regular general election.

JOINT RESOLUTION

2 Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

<u>PARAGRAPH 1.</u> Section 15, Article IV of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, is amended
to read:

5 Sec. 15. Either house may punish its members for disorderly behavior, and may with the con-6 currence of two thirds, expel a member; but not a second time for the same cause. Failure to at-7 tend, without permission or excuse, 10 or more scheduled legislative floor sessions of the 8 house the unexcused and absent member is a part of that are called to transact business 9 during a regular or special session of the Legislative Assembly: 10 (1) Is disorderly behavior under this section; and

(2) Shall disqualify the member from holding office as a Senator or a Representative for
the term following the member's current term of office.[-]
