Senate Joint Resolution 5

Sponsored by Senator GOLDEN (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution establishing right to clean and healthy environment and to preservation of natural, cultural, scenic, recreational and healthful qualities of environment. Requires state to serve as trustee of natural resources and maintain natural resources for benefit of all people.

Refers proposed amendment to people for their approval or rejection at next general election.

1	JOINT RESOLUTION
2	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
3	PARAGRAPH 1. The Constitution of the State of Oregon is amended by creating a new section
4	47 to be added to and made a part of Article I, such section to read:
5	SECTION 47. (1) The people of this state have the right to a clean and healthy environ-
6	ment, including pure water, clean air, healthy ecosystems and a stable climate, and to the
7	preservation of the natural, cultural, scenic, recreational and healthful qualities of the en-
8	vironment. The state shall not infringe upon these rights, by action or inaction.
9	(2) The state, including each branch, agency and political subdivision, shall serve as
10	trustee of all the natural resources of this state. The trust assets to be protected shall in-
11	clude this state's waters, air, wildlife, fisheries, atmosphere, climate, public lands and na-
12	tural ecosystems. The state shall conserve, protect and maintain these natural resources for
13	the benefit of all the people, including generations yet to come.
14	(3) The rights stated in this section are self-executing, inherent and indefeasible, are
15	among those rights reserved to the people and are in addition to, and may not be constrained
16	by or limited to, those rights conferred by the state's public trust doctrine or wildlife trust
17	doctrine.

19	PARAGRAPH 2. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the
20	people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election held throughout
21	this state.
