## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2363

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, delete "and prescrib-" and delete line

2 3 and insert "and declaring an emergency.".

3 Delete lines 5 through 31 and delete page 2 insert:

4 **"SECTION 1.** ORS 471.190 is amended to read:

5 "471.190. (1) The holder of a temporary sales license may:

6 "(a) Sell at retail by the drink wine, malt beverages, cider and distilled7 liquor.

8 "(b) Sell for consumption off the licensed premises wine, malt beverages9 and cider in factory-sealed containers.

"(c) Sell for consumption off the licensed premises wine, malt beverages
and cider in securely covered containers supplied by the consumer and hav ing capacities of not more than two gallons each.

"(2) Distilled liquor served by the holder of a temporary sales license must be purchased from a retail sales agent of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission. The holder of a temporary sales license must provide food service as required by commission rule.

17 "(3) A temporary sales license may be issued only to:

"(a) Nonprofit or charitable organizations that are registered with thestate.

"(b) A political committee that has filed a statement of organization un der ORS 260.039 or 260.042.

1 "(c) State agencies.

2 "(d) Local governments, and agencies and departments of local govern-3 ments.

"(e) Persons not otherwise described in this subsection, as long as the applicant submits a plan that is approved by the commission detailing how minors will be prevented from gaining access to alcoholic beverages and how minors will be prevented from gaining access to any portion of the licensed premises prohibited to minors under ORS 471.430 (3) or any rule adopted by the commission.

"(4) The commission may by rule establish additional eligibility require ments for temporary sales licenses.

"(5) Subject to such qualifications as the commission may establish by
rule, persons who hold a full or limited on-premises sales license are eligible
for temporary sales licenses.

"(6)(a) A temporary sales license issued to a person described in
subsection (3)(a), (c) or (d) of this section authorizes the holder of the
temporary sales license to:

"(A)(i) Have on a single licensed premises more than one location
at which wine, malt beverages, cider or distilled liquor are sold at re tail by the drink or for consumption off the licensed premises; or

"(ii) Have up to three separate premises in this state licensed under
the temporary sales license at which wine, malt beverages or cider are
sold for consumption off the licensed premises; and

"(B) Operate for up to 30 days, whether or not the days are con secutive.

"[(6)] (7) A person holding a temporary sales license is not required to obtain an intermittent temporary restaurant, seasonal temporary restaurant, single-event temporary restaurant license or mobile unit license under ORS chapter 624 if only wine, malt beverages and cider in single-service containers are served and only nonperishable food items that are exempted from
licensure by the Oregon Health Authority are served.

<sup>3</sup> "[(7)] (8) Employees and volunteers serving alcoholic beverages for a <sup>4</sup> nonprofit or charitable organization licensed under this section are not re-<sup>5</sup> quired to have service permits or to complete an alcohol server education <sup>6</sup> program and examination under ORS 471.542. The commission by rule may <sup>7</sup> establish education requirements for servers described in this subsection.

8 "[(8)] (9) Notwithstanding ORS 471.392 to 471.400, a temporary sales li-9 cense may be issued to a nonprofit trade association that has a membership 10 primarily composed of persons that hold winery licenses issued under ORS 11 471.223 or grower sales privilege licenses issued under ORS 471.227.

"SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 471.190 by section 1 of this
2021 Act apply to temporary sales licenses issued on or after January
1, 2021.

"SECTION 3. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect on its passage.".

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
