**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 2932**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 30 and delete page
2 2 and insert:

3 **“SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:**

4 **“(a) ‘Law enforcement unit’ has the meaning given that term in**
5 **ORS 181A.355.**

6 **“(b) ‘Local correctional facility’ has the meaning given that term**
7 **in ORS 169.005.**

8 **“(c) ‘Peace officer’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 161.015.**

9 **“(2) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall establish a**
10 **statewide database of reports of the use of physical force by peace of-**
11 **ficers and deaths in custody of law enforcement units. The database**
12 **must be searchable and available to the public.**

13 **“(3) For each instance in which a peace officer employed by a law**
14 **enforcement unit uses physical force against an individual, or when a**
15 **death occurs while an individual is in the custody of a law enforce-**
16 **ment unit, the law enforcement unit shall report to the commission**
17 **and to the Federal Bureau of Investigation as soon as practicable:**

18 **“(a) The following information about each officer who used physical**
19 **force:**

20 **“(A) Name.**

21 **“(B) Certification number.**

- 1 “(C) Race.
- 2 “(D) Gender.
- 3 “(E) Age.
- 4 “(F) Height and weight.
- 5 “(G) Years of experience.
- 6 “(H) Whether the officer is a full-time or part-time employee.
- 7 “(I) Whether the officer was readily identifiable.
- 8 “(b) The certification numbers of all officers present at the incident
- 9 who did not use physical force.
- 10 “(c) The date, time and location of the use of physical force.
- 11 “(d) The perceived race, gender, age, religion, height and weight of
- 12 the person against whom physical force was used.
- 13 “(e) A description of the physical force used.
- 14 “(f) A description of the severity of the physical force used.
- 15 “(g) A description of any injuries sustained by officers and persons
- 16 against whom physical force was used.
- 17 “(h) Whether the officer who used physical force was on duty.
- 18 “(i) Whether the officer who used physical force used a weapon or
- 19 discharged a firearm.
- 20 “(j) Whether the use of physical force was investigated by the law
- 21 enforcement unit or the Department of Public Safety Standards and
- 22 Training, and the outcome of the investigation.
- 23 “(k) Whether a citizen complained about the use of physical force,
- 24 and the outcome of the complaint.
- 25 “(L) Whether the law enforcement unit initiated the contact that
- 26 ended in the use of physical force.
- 27 “(m) Whether officers were ambushed.
- 28 “(n) Whether a supervisor was present during the use of physical
- 29 force.
- 30 “(o) The reason for the presence of officers at the incident that

1 ended in the use of physical force.

2 “(p) Whether the person against whom physical force was used re-
3 sisted.

4 “(q) A description of any threats against officers or others made
5 by the person against whom physical force was used.

6 “(r) Whether the person against whom physical force was used ap-
7 peared to be impaired.

8 “(4) A law enforcement unit may not report to the commission the
9 name, address, Social Security number or other unique personally
10 identifiable information of a person against whom physical force was
11 used.

12 “(5) At least once each calendar quarter, the Department of Cor-
13 rections and a local correctional facility shall submit to the commis-
14 sion data related to deaths in custody collected under and on forms
15 established by the Bureau of Justice Statistics of the United States
16 Department of Justice in accordance with the federal Death in Custody
17 Reporting Act (P.L. 113-242).

18 “(6) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall report annually
19 to an appropriate committee or interim committee of the Legislative
20 Assembly on the reports received under this section, aggregated and
21 broken down by law enforcement unit.”.

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
