## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3130

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 31 and delete page 2 2 and insert:

<sup>3</sup> **"SECTION 1.** ORS 342.610 is amended to read:

"342.610. (1) [Teachers employed as substitute teachers shall] A teacher 4 employed or performing services as a substitute teacher may not be 5paid less per day than 85 percent of 1/190th of the salary of a beginning 6 teacher who holds a bachelor's degree. The salary of the substitute teacher 7 shall be computed as required in this subsection based on the statewide av-8 erage salary for beginning teachers who hold bachelor's degrees. The De-9 partment of Education shall compute the statewide average salary to be used 10 for purposes of this subsection, using the latest data available to the de-11 partment, but not data from earlier than the preceding school year. 12

"(2) [*The*] **A** school district shall set the working hours for a substitute teacher, and, when **the substitute teacher is** employed **by or performing services for the school district**, **the school district** shall pay the substitute teacher a salary that is no less than one-half of the daily minimum salary computed under subsection (1) of this section. However, if the substitute teacher is employed **or performing services** for more than one-half day, the substitute teacher shall receive a full day's pay.

"(3)(a) Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section, [teachers employed
 as substitute teachers] a teacher employed or performing services as a

substitute teacher for more than 10 consecutive days in any one assignment for the same teacher shall not be paid after the 10th day of the assignment less per day than 100 percent of 1/190th of the statewide average salary computed in subsection (1) of this section for districts with no salary scale; or, for districts with a salary scale, the higher of:

6 "(A) 1/190th of the [*employing*] school district's salary for a beginning 7 teacher who holds a bachelor's degree; or

8 "(B) The daily minimum salary computed under subsection (1) of this9 section.

"(b) Used sick leave, whether paid or unpaid, and weekends, school holidays and days when schools are closed by weather or other conditions and when substitute teachers are not required to appear in person at the school shall not be considered in determining consecutive days for purposes of this subsection.

"(c) When substituting for a part-time teacher, the part of the day worked
by [*the substitute*] a substitute teacher shall count as a full day in determining consecutive days for purposes of this subsection.

"(4) Notwithstanding subsections (1) and (3) of this section, if a school
district has a class schedule based on a four-day week:

20 "(a) The daily minimum salary computed under subsection (1) or (3) of 21 this section must be multiplied by 1.125; and

"(b) Calculations described in subsection (3) of this section must be made after a teacher has been employed **or performed services** as a substitute teacher for more than eight consecutive days in any one assignment for the same teacher.

"(5) A teacher employed by or performing services for a school dis trict as a substitute teacher shall be:

"(a) Considered to be an employee of the school district, regardless
 of whether the school district delegates any aspect of the management
 of the teacher to a third party; and

"(b) Considered to be in a qualifying position for purposes of public
employee retirement benefits, as provided by ORS 238.005 (22) or
238A.005 (15).

4 "[(5)] (6) This section does not apply to substitute teachers represented 5 in a bargaining unit in the school district by which they are employed.

"SECTION 2. (1) For purposes of public employees' retirement law,
the amendments to ORS 342.610 by section 1 of this 2021 Act apply to
employment or the performance of service that occurred on or after
January 1, 2015.

"(2) To the extent allowed by public employees' retirement law, a
teacher shall be eligible for any retirement benefits that would have
accrued to the teacher under ORS 342.610 (5), as amended by section
1 of this 2021 Act, on or after January 1, 2015.".

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
