"FIRE MARSHAL TASK FORCE

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²⁰ "SECTION 152a. (1) The Fire Marshal Task Force is established.

21 "(2) The task force consists of 16 members as follows:

- "(a) Two members from the Senate appointed by the President of
 the Senate;
- "(b) Two members from the House of Representatives appointed by
 the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 5 "(c) The Governor's Public Safety Policy Advisor;
- 6 "(d) The State Resilience Officer;
- 7 "(e) The State Fire Marshal; and
- 8 "(f) Nine members appointed by the Governor as follows:
- 9 "(A) One member to represent the State Forestry Department;
- 10 "(B) One member to represent fire chiefs in Oregon;
- 11 "(C) One member to represent special districts;
- 12 "(D) One member to represent volunteer firefighters;
- "(E) One member to represent firefighters employed by or under
 contract with a state agency; and
- 15 "(F) Four members appointed from the public at large.
- 16 "(3) The task force shall make recommendations as to whether the 17 office of the State Fire Marshal should be made an independent state 18 agency, and if not, in which existing state agency the Office of the 19 Fire Marshal should be housed. The task force's recommendations 20 must describe the rationales for the decisions of the task force.

"(4) No later than February 1, 2022, the task force shall submit a report on its findings and recommendations, which may include recommendations for legislation, to the standing or interim committees of the Legislative Assembly with subject matter responsibility for veterans and emergency management.

"(5) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a
 quorum for the transaction of business.

"(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a
 majority of the members of the task force.

30 "(7) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as

1 chairperson.

"(8) If there is a vacancy among the appointed members for any
cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become
immediately effective.

"(9) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the
call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task
force.

8 "(10) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation
9 of the task force.

"(11) The Office of Emergency Management shall provide staff sup port to the task force.

"(12) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation
 or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task
 force.

15 "(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, 16 are directed to assist the task force in the performance of the duties 17 of the task force and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to 18 confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the 19 task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

"SECTION 153. - 11 "(2) The Department of State Police.

"SECTION 154. 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"SECTION 155. Sections 1, 10 to 15, 25a, 97, 104 to 107a and 148 to

Act become operative on July 1, 2023.

"SECTION 155a. Sections 89 and 91 to 96 of this 2021 Act and the
 amendments to statute by section 90 of this 2021 Act become operative
 on January 1, 2024.

"SECTION 155b. Between the operative date specified in section 155
 of this 2021 Act and the operative date specified in section 155a of this
 2021 Act:

"(1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, statutory references to the Department of the State Fire Marshal shall be construed
to mean the office of the State Fire Marshal in the Department of
State Police.

"(2) Duties, functions and powers conferred on the Department of
the State Fire Marshal are conferred on the office of the State Fire
Marshal in the Department of State Police.

"(3) Moneys appropriated to the Department of the State Fire
Marshal shall be construed as appropriations to the Department of
State Police for purposes of the office of the State Fire Marshal.".
