PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2856

In line 2 of the printed bill, before the period insert "; amending ORS 408.225, 408.235 and 408.237".

3 Delete lines 4 through 8 and insert:

4 **"SECTION 1.** ORS 408.235 is amended to read:

"408.235. (1) A veteran is eligible to use the preference provided for in
ORS 408.230 for a civil service position for which application is made at any
time after discharge or release from service in the Armed Forces.

"(2) A veteran must provide evidence of eligibility for the preference 8 at the time the veteran makes application for the position. Evidence 9 may include federal DD Form 214 or 215, official records of 10 entitlements from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs 11 or any other documentation demonstrating preference eligibility. 12 Failure to provide evidence at the time of application will disqualify 13 the veteran from requesting use of the preference in the public 14 15employer's consideration of the veteran's application for the position.

¹⁷ "408.237. (1) As used in this section:

"(a) 'Eligibility list' means a list of ranked eligible candidates for a civil
service position who have become eligible for the position through a test or
series of tests and who will be considered for the civil service position in
ranked order.

"(b) 'Transferable skill' means a skill that a veteran has obtained through military education or experience that substantially relates, directly or indirectly, to the civil service position for which the veteran is applying.

"(2) When an interview is a component of the selection process for a civil
service position or for an eligibility list for a civil service position, a public
employer shall interview each veteran:

"(a) Whom the public employer determines meets the minimum qualifications and special qualifications for the civil service position or eligibility
list; and

"(b) Who submits application materials that the public employer determines show sufficient evidence that the veteran has the transferable skills required and requested by the public employer for the civil service position or eligibility list.

"[(3) A public employer is not required to comply with subsection (2) of this
section if the employer conducts interviews only as part of the process of selecting a candidate for a civil service position from an eligibility list.]

"(3) If a public employer does not interview a veteran who applies for a civil service position, the public employer shall, within 14 days of the decision not to interview the veteran, provide to the veteran a written explanation of the employer's reasons for the decision not to interview the veteran.

"(4) A public employer may consult with the Oregon Military Department
 and the Department of Veterans' Affairs to determine whether certain mili tary education or experience produces a transferable skill.

"(5) The Department of Veterans' Affairs shall provide training to veterans on how to show evidence of transferable skills in an application for a
civil service position or eligibility list.

"(6) Violation of subsection (2) of this section is an unlawful employment
 practice under ORS chapter 659A.

30 "(7) A veteran claiming to be aggrieved by a violation of subsection (2)

1 of this section may file a complaint under ORS 659A.820.

³ "408.225. (1) As used in ORS 408.225 to 408.237:

"(a)(A) 'Civil service position' means any position for which a hiring or promotion decision is made or required to be made based on the results of a merit based, competitive process that includes, but is not limited to, consideration of an applicant's or employee's relative ability, knowledge, experience and other skills.

9 "(B) A 'civil service position' need not be labeled a 'civil service 10 position.'

"(b) 'Combat zone' means an area designated by the President of the United States by executive order in which, on the dates designated by executive order, the Armed Forces of the United States are or have engaged in combat.

"(c) 'Disabled veteran' means a veteran who has a disability rating from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, a veteran whose discharge or release from active duty was for a disability incurred or aggravated in the line of duty or a veteran who was awarded the Purple Heart for wounds received in combat.

"(d) 'Honorable conditions' [has the meaning given that term in rules adopted by the Department of Veterans' Affairs.] **means:**

"(A) A character of service recognized as honorable by the United
 States Department of Defense; or

"(B) A character of service that is recognized by the United States
 Department of Veterans Affairs as honorable for purposes of the de partment.

"(e) 'Public employer' means a public body, as that term is defined in ORS
174.109, and any person authorized to act on behalf of the public body, with
respect to control, management or supervision of any employee.
