**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
HOUSE BILL 2927**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, delete “and”.

3 In line 15, before the period insert “; and declaring an emergency”.

4 On page 5, line 15, delete “2023” and insert “2021”.

5 In line 18, delete “2023” and insert “2021”.

7 On page 7, delete lines 1 through 5 and insert:

8 **“SECTION 16.** ORS 401.094 is amended to read:

9 “401.094. (1)(a) The Department of State Police shall maintain a system  
10 for the notification and interagency coordination of state resources in re-  
11 sponse to emergencies involving multijurisdictional cooperation between the  
12 various levels of government and private business entities.

13 “(b) The department shall provide the [*Office*] **Oregon Department** of  
14 Emergency Management with a service level agreement that describes the  
15 continued daily operations and maintenance of the system, the services and  
16 supplies needed to maintain the system 24 hours a day, every day of the year,  
17 and the policies and procedures that support the overall notification system.

18 “(2) The notification system shall be managed by the [*Office*] **Oregon**  
19 **Department** of Emergency Management as a continuously available com-  
20 munications network and a component of the state’s emergency operations  
21 center.

1 “(3) The notification system shall be the primary point of contact by  
2 which any public agency provides the state notification of an emergency or  
3 disaster, or requests access to state and federal resources.

4 “(4) Each department of state government, and those agencies of state  
5 government identified in the statewide emergency management plan prepared  
6 under ORS 401.052 as having emergency service or administrative responsi-  
7 bilities, shall appoint an emergency management coordinator as their repre-  
8 sentative to work with the [Office] **Oregon Department** of Emergency  
9 Management on the development and implementation of emergency plans and  
10 procedures.

11 “(5) The [Office] **Oregon Department** of Emergency Management shall  
12 adopt rules relating to the planning, administration and operation of the  
13 notification system maintained under this section.

14 “**SECTION 16a.** ORS 401.094, as amended by section 16 of this 2021 Act,  
15 is amended to read:

16 “401.094. (1)[(a)] The **Oregon** Department of [State Police] **Emergency**  
17 **Management** shall maintain a system for the notification and interagency  
18 coordination of state resources in response to emergencies involving multi-  
19 jurisdictional cooperation between the various levels of government and  
20 private business entities.

21 “[*(b) The department shall provide the Oregon Department of Emergency*  
22 *Management with a service level agreement that describes the continued daily*  
23 *operations and maintenance of the system, the services and supplies needed to*  
24 *maintain the system 24 hours a day, every day of the year, and the policies and*  
25 *procedures that support the overall notification system.*]

26 “(2) The notification system shall be managed by the [Oregon Department  
27 of Emergency Management] **department** as a continuously available com-  
28 munications network and a component of the state’s emergency operations  
29 center.

30 “(3) The notification system shall be the primary point of contact by

1 which any public agency provides the state notification of an emergency or  
2 disaster, or requests access to state and federal resources.

3 “(4) Each department of state government, and those agencies of state  
4 government identified in the statewide emergency management plan prepared  
5 under ORS 401.052 as having emergency service or administrative responsi-  
6 bilities, shall appoint an emergency management coordinator as their repre-  
7 sentative to work with the [*Oregon Department of Emergency Management*]  
8 **department** on the development and implementation of emergency plans and  
9 procedures.

10 “(5) The [*Oregon Department of Emergency Management*] **department**  
11 shall adopt rules relating to the planning, administration and operation of  
12 the notification system maintained under this section.”

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8 **“TASK FORCE ON IMPLEMENTATION**

10 **“SECTION 152a. (1) The Task Force on Implementation is estab-**  
11 **lished.**

12 **“(2) The task force consists of the members of the Governor’s Fire**  
13 **Service Policy Council created under ORS 476.680. Nonvoting members**  
14 **of the council are nonvoting members of the task force.**

15 **“(3) The task force shall make recommendations as to whether the**  
16 **office of the State Fire Marshal should be made an independent state**  
17 **agency, and, if not, in which existing state agency the office of the**  
18 **State Fire Marshal should be housed. The task force’s recommen-**  
19 **dations must describe the rationales for the decisions of the task force.**

20 **“(4) No later than February 1, 2022, the task force shall submit a**  
21 **report on its findings and recommendations, which may include rec-**  
22 **ommendations for legislation, to the standing or interim committees**  
23 **of the Legislative Assembly with subject matter responsibility for**  
24 **veterans and emergency management.**

25 **“(5) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes**  
26 **a quorum for the transaction of business.**

27 **“(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a**  
28 **majority of the voting members of the task force.**

29 **“(7) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as**  
30 **chairperson.**

1       “(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the  
2 call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the  
3 task force.

4       “(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of  
5 the task force.

6       “(10) The office of the State Fire Marshal shall provide staff support  
7 to the task force.

8       “(11) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation  
9 or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task  
10 force.

11       “(12) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111,  
12 are directed to assist the task force in the performance of the duties  
13 of the task force and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to  
14 confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the  
15 task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

16       “SECTION 152b. Section 152a of this 2021 Act is repealed on January  
17 2, 2023.

18       “SECTION 153. The Governor or the following agencies may take  
19 any action before the operative date specified in section 155 of this 2021  
20 Act that is necessary for the Governor or agency to exercise, on or  
21 after the operative date specified in section 155 of this 2021 Act, all of  
22 the duties, functions and powers conferred on the Governor or agency  
23 by sections 1, 10 to 15, 25a, 97, 104 to 107a and 148 to 152 of this 2021  
24 Act and the amendments to statutes and session law by sections 2 to  
25 9, 16, 17 to 25, 26 to 88, 98 to 103 and 108 to 147 of this 2021 Act:

26       “(1) The Office of Emergency Management;

27       “(2) The Oregon Military Department;

28       “(3) The office of the State Fire Marshal;

29       “(4) The Department of State Police; or

30       “(5) The Oregon Homeland Security Council.
