The 13 mission of the council is to assess risks to the safety and security of 14 the State of Oregon with special emphasis on matters related to do-15mestic terrorism and other major threats to the people of Oregon, in-16 cluding critical infrastructure, and make formal to to 17 recommendations to the Governor with respect to homeland security 18 **policy**. "(d) Recommend policies to the Emergency Preparedness Advisory
 Council on subjects associated with the mission.

"[(5)] (6) The [Adjutant General] Director of the Oregon Department
 of Emergency Management is the vice chairperson of the council and
 serves as the chairperson in the absence of the Governor.

"[(6)] (7) Members of the council are not entitled to compensation under ORS 292.495. The [director] Governor, in the [director's] Governor's discretion, may reimburse members of the council as provided in ORS 292.495 for actual and necessary travel or other expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as members of the council.

"(8) A majority of the members of the council constitutes a quorum
for the transaction of business.

"(9) Official action by the council requires the approval of a majority of the members of the council.

5 "(10) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority

"(11) The council shall meet as needed to carry out the mission of
the council, at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson

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## **"EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS ADVISORY COUNCIL**

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28 "<u>SECTION 151.</u> (1) The Emergency Preparedness Advisory Council 29 is established within the Office of the Governor. The mission of the 30 council is to facilitate policy recommendations for catastrophic disas-

ter preparedness, mitigation and response and recovery planning,
 procedures and protocols with special emphasis on outreach to representatives of designated state and federal emergency support func tions.
