**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 3127**

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after “recovery” insert “; and declaring an
2 emergency”.

5 **“DEFINITION**
6

7 **“SECTION 1. As used in sections 2 to 35 of this 2021 Act, ‘local**
8 **government’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 174.116.**
9

10 **“WATER INFRASTRUCTURE**
11

12 **“SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
13 **the amount of \$105,000,000 is established for the biennium beginning**
14 **July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lot-**
15 **tery bond proceeds collected or received by the Department of Envi-**
16 **ronmental Quality for distribution to local governments and nonprofit**
17 **organizations for sewer, septic and other water infrastructure needs**
18 **related to the 2020 wildfires or expenditure by the department for such**
19 **purposes.**

20 **“SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
21 **the amount of \$6,000,000 is established for the biennium beginning July**

1 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery
2 bond proceeds collected or received by the Oregon Business Develop-
3 ment Department for distribution to local governments for sewer,
4 septic and other water infrastructure needs related to the 2020
5 wildfires.

6 **“SECTION 4.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
7 ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Business Development De-
8 partment, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General
9 Fund, the amount of \$5,525,000, for distribution to local governments
10 for water infrastructure needs related to the 2020 wildfires.

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12 **“TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND UTILITY INFRASTRUCTURE**

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14 **“SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
15 the amount of \$13,000,000 is established for the biennium beginning
16 July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lot-
17 tery bond proceeds collected or received by the Oregon Business De-
18 velopment Department for distribution to local governments for radio
19 system, communication and utility infrastructure needs related to the
20 2020 wildfires.

21 **“SECTION 6.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
22 ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Business Development De-
23 partment, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General
24 Fund, the amount of \$80,000, for distribution to Crawford Electric for
25 temporary power pole needs related to the 2020 wildfires.

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27 **“FIRE AND PUBLIC SAFETY INFRASTRUCTURE**

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29 **“SECTION 7.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
30 ation, there is appropriated to the State Fire Marshal, for the

1 biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount
2 of \$19,100,000, for distribution to local governments for fire
3 infrastructure and acquiring or upgrading property with fire
4 infrastructure related to the 2020 wildfires or expenditure by the office
5 of the State Fire Marshal for such purposes.

6 **“SECTION 8.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
7 ation, there is appropriated to the Department of State Police, for the
8 biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount
9 of \$1,200,000, for distribution to local governments for enhanced public
10 safety patrol needs related to the 2020 wildfires.

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“TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE

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14 **“SECTION 9.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
15 the amount of \$7,500,000 is established for the biennium beginning July
16 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from the State
17 Highway Fund collected or received by the Department of Transpor-
18 tation for distribution to local governments for repair and replacement
19 of transportation infrastructure related to the 2020 wildfires.

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“REVENUE REPLACEMENT

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23 **“SECTION 10.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
24 ation, there is appropriated to the Department of Revenue, for the
25 biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount
26 of \$48,250,000, for deposit into the Lost Revenue Stabilization Fund
27 established under section 1, chapter __, Oregon Laws 2021 (Enrolled
28 House Bill 3367).

“EDUCATION

1 **SECTION 11.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
2 ation, there is appropriated to the Department of Education, for the
3 biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount
4 of \$7,500,000, for deposit into the School Stabilization Fund established
5 under section 2, chapter __, Oregon Laws 2021 (Enrolled House Bill
6 3367).

7 **SECTION 12.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
8 ation, there is appropriated to the Higher Education Coordinating
9 Commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the Gen-
10 eral Fund, the amount of \$5,650,000, for distribution to a community
11 college and a public university to support higher education and offset
12 revenue losses related to the 2020 wildfires.

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14 **“COST SHARE**

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16 **SECTION 13.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
17 ation, there is appropriated to the Department of Transportation, for
18 the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the
19 amount of \$15,000,000, for hazardous waste and structural debris
20 cleanup cost sharing related to the 2020 wildfires.

21 **SECTION 14.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
22 ation, there is appropriated to the Department of Environmental
23 Quality, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General
24 Fund, the amount of \$3,000,000, for hazardous waste and structural
25 debris cleanup cost sharing related to the 2020 wildfires.

26 **SECTION 15.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
27 ation, there is appropriated to the Office of Emergency Management,
28 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the
29 amount of \$50,000,000, for securing nonfederal cost sharing to leverage
30 Federal Emergency Management Agency Hazard Mitigation Funds re-

1 lated to the 2020 wildfires.

2 **“SECTION 16.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
3 ation, there is appropriated to the State Fire Marshal, for the
4 biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount
5 of \$5,000, for distribution to a rural fire protection district for cost
6 sharing with the Federal Emergency Management Agency related to
7 the 2020 wildfires.

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9 **“BUSINESS AND COMMERCIAL DISTRICTS**

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11 **“SECTION 17.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
12 ation, there is appropriated to the State Parks and Recreation De-
13 partment, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General
14 Fund, the amount of \$5,000,000, for providing grants through the
15 Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant Program to commercial dis-
16 tricts impacted by the 2020 wildfires.

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18 **“STAFFING CAPACITY**

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20 **“SECTION 18.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
21 ation, there is appropriated to the Office of Emergency Management,
22 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the
23 amount of \$3,250,000, for response and recovery staffing related to the
24 2020 wildfires.

25 **“SECTION 19.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
26 ation, there is appropriated to the Department of Land Conservation
27 and Development, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the
28 General Fund, the amount of \$400,000, for planning staff related to the
29 2020 wildfires.

30 **“SECTION 20.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-

1 ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services
2 Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the Gen-
3 eral Fund, the amount of \$_____, for the Community Development
4 Block Grant Disaster Recovery Program related to the 2020 wildfires.

5 **“SECTION 21.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
6 ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Business Development De-
7 partment, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General
8 Fund, the amount of \$14,000,000, for distribution to local governments
9 for staffing and materials reimbursement related to the 2020 wildfires.

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11 **“HOUSING**
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13 **“SECTION 22.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
14 the amount of \$350,000,000 is established for the biennium beginning
15 July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lot-
16 tery bond proceeds collected or received by the Housing and Commu-
17 nity Services Department for renovation, reconstruction and
18 replacement of homes, mobile homes and manufactured housing units,
19 temporary rental and relocation assistance and land acquisition for
20 housing related to the 2020 wildfires.

21 **“SECTION 23.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
22 ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services
23 Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the Gen-
24 eral Fund, the amount of \$60,000,000, for county housing development
25 and programs, housing subsidies and a bulk purchasing lumber re-
26 volving loan program to assist with rebuilding related to the 2020
27 wildfires.

28 **“SECTION 24.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
29 ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services
30 Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the Gen-

1 eral Fund, the amount of \$_____, for the Oregon Rebuilding
2 Oregon housing initiative related to the 2020 wildfires.

3 **“SECTION 25.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
4 ation, there is appropriated to the Department of Human Services, for
5 the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the
6 amount of \$90,000,000, for feeding and sheltering survivors of the 2020
7 wildfires.

8 **“SECTION 26.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
9 ation, there is appropriated to the Department of Consumer and
10 Business Services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the
11 General Fund, the amount of \$10,000,000, for a grant program to
12 incentivize residential and commercial fire hardening and resiliency
13 for 2020 wildfire survivors who are rebuilding and repairing dwellings
14 and other structures that were destroyed or damaged in the 2020
15 wildfires.

16 **“SECTION 27.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
17 ation, there is appropriated to the State Department of Energy, for the
18 biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount
19 of \$10,000,000, for a grant program to incentivize residential and com-
20 mercial energy efficiency for 2020 wildfire survivors who are rebuilding
21 and repairing dwellings and other structures that were destroyed or
22 damaged in the 2020 wildfires.

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“NATURAL RESOURCES

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26 **“SECTION 28.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
27 the amount of \$41,000,000 is established for the biennium beginning
28 July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lot-
29 tery bond proceeds collected or received by the State Forestry De-
30 partment for stabilization projects, seeding for erosion control and

1 **invasive species control related to the 2020 wildfires.**

2 **“SECTION 29. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-**
3 **ation, there is appropriated to the State Forestry Department, for the**
4 **biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount**
5 **of \$5,000,000, for developing tree seedling, nursery capacity and tree**
6 **supply for replanting in regions of this state impacted by the 2020**
7 **wildfires.**

8 **“SECTION 30. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
9 **the amount of \$6,500,000 is established for the biennium beginning July**
10 **1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery**
11 **bond proceeds collected or received by the Department of Environ-**
12 **mental Quality for drinking water intake protections, repair and**
13 **monitoring in regions of this state impacted by the 2020 wildfires.**

14 **“SECTION 31. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
15 **the amount of \$1,250,000 is established for the biennium beginning July**
16 **1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery**
17 **bond proceeds collected or received by the State Department of**
18 **Geology and Mineral Industries for geotechnical analysis to assess**
19 **risks of landslides and debris flows in regions of this state impacted**
20 **by the 2020 wildfires.**

21 **“SECTION 32. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-**
22 **ation, there is appropriated to the Department of Transportation, for**
23 **the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the**
24 **amount of \$1,250,000, for developing tree seedling, nursery capacity and**
25 **tree supply for the assessment of cultural resources in advance of re-**
26 **covery actions in regions of this state impacted by the 2020 wildfires.**

27 **“SECTION 33. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-**
28 **ation, there is appropriated to the State Marine Board, for the**
29 **biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount**
30 **of \$2,000,000, for maintenance of navigable rivers impacted by the 2020**

1 **wildfires.**

2 **“SECTION 34. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
3 **the amount of \$500,000 is established for the biennium beginning July**
4 **1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery**
5 **bond proceeds collected or received by the Oregon Watershed En-**
6 **hancement Board for McKenzie watershed recovery, water quality**
7 **monitoring and geographic information system analysis related to the**
8 **2020 wildfires.**

9 **“SECTION 35. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-**
10 **ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Watershed Enhancement**
11 **Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General**
12 **Fund, the amount of \$32,750,000, for environmental restoration, pro-**
13 **tection and improvement, targeted acquisition of floodplain properties,**
14 **in consultation with tribal communities, and repair of recreational**
15 **facilities related to the 2020 wildfires.**

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17 **“MISCELLANEOUS**

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19 **“SECTION 36. The unit captions used in this 2021 Act are provided**
20 **only for the convenience of the reader and do not become part of the**
21 **statutory law of this state or express any legislative intent in the**
22 **enactment of this 2021 Act.**

23 **“SECTION 37. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate**
24 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
25 **declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect July 1, 2021.”.**

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
