**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
HOUSE BILL 2456**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “ORS” delete the rest of the  
2 line and insert “178.375, 181A.195, 307.515, 307.519, 307.540, 307.651, 307.677,  
3 307.681, 307.827, 315.514, 315.643, 317.710 and 320.470 and sections 6, 7, 9 and  
4 10, chapter 826, Oregon Laws 2005; repealing ORS 315.601 and 315.606; and  
5 prescribing an effective date.”.

6 Delete lines 3 through 6.

7 Delete lines 8 through 17 and delete pages 2 through 19 and insert:

8 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 178.375 is amended to read:

9 “178.375. As used in this section and ORS 178.380 and 178.385:

10 “(1) ‘ABLE account’ means an account established by an eligible individ-  
11 ual, owned by the eligible individual and maintained under the qualified  
12 ABLE program established by the Oregon 529 Savings Board under ORS  
13 178.380.

14 “(2) ‘ABLE Act’ means the Stephen Beck, Jr., Achieving a Better Life  
15 Experience Act of 2014 (Division B of P.L. 113-295).

16 “(3) ‘Designated beneficiary’ has the same meaning as contained in sec-  
17 tion 529A of the Internal Revenue Code.

18 “(4) ‘Eligible individual’ has the same meaning as contained in section  
19 529A of the Internal Revenue Code.

20 “(5) ‘Internal Revenue Code’ means the federal Internal Revenue Code as  
21 amended and in effect on [*December 31, 2017*] **April 1, 2021**.

1 “(6) ‘Qualified disability expense’ has the same meaning as contained in  
2 section 529A of the Internal Revenue Code.

3 **“SECTION 2.** ORS 307.515 is amended to read:

4 “307.515. As used in ORS 307.515 to 307.523:

5 “(1) ‘Governing body’ means the city or county legislative body having  
6 jurisdiction over the property for which an exemption may be applied for  
7 under ORS 307.515 to 307.523.

8 “(2) ‘Lender’ means the provider of a loan secured by the recorded deed  
9 of trust or recorded mortgage made to finance the purchase, construction or  
10 rehabilitation of a property used for low income housing under the criteria  
11 listed in or adopted under ORS 307.517 or 307.518.

12 **“(3) According to the election of a governing body pursuant to ORS**  
13 **307.519 (1), ‘low income’ means:**

14 **“(a) Income at or below 60 percent of the area median income as deter-**  
15 **mined by the Oregon Housing Stability Council based on information from**  
16 **the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development[.];**

17 **“(b)(A) For the initial year that persons occupy property for which**  
18 **an application for exemption is filed under ORS 307.521, income at or**  
19 **below 60 percent of the area median income as determined by the**  
20 **Oregon Housing Stability Council based on information from the**  
21 **United States Department of Housing and Urban Development; and**

22 **“(B) For every subsequent consecutive year that the persons occupy**  
23 **the property, income at or below 80 percent of the area median income**  
24 **as determined by the Oregon Housing Stability Council based on in-**  
25 **formation from the United States Department of Housing and Urban**  
26 **Development; or**

27 **“(c) For housing units on property that is awarded tax credits**  
28 **through the federal Low-Income Housing Tax Credit program and is**  
29 **a qualified low-income housing project meeting the requirements of**  
30 **26 U.S.C. 42(g)(1)(C), income at or below 80 percent of the area median**

1 **income as determined by the Oregon Housing Stability Council based**  
2 **on information from the United States Department of Housing and**  
3 **Urban Development, provided the average area median income of all**  
4 **housing units on the property is at or below 60 percent of the area**  
5 **median income as determined by the Oregon Housing Stability Council**  
6 **based on information from the United States Department of Housing**  
7 **and Urban Development.**

8 **“SECTION 3.** ORS 307.519 is amended to read:

9 “307.519. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, the ex-  
10 emptions granted under ORS 307.515 to 307.523 apply only to the tax levy of  
11 a governing body that adopts the provisions of ORS 307.515 to 307.523. **At**  
12 **the time of adoption, the governing body shall elect a definition of ‘low**  
13 **income’ under ORS 307.515.**

14 “(2) The exemptions granted under ORS 307.515 to 307.523 apply to the tax  
15 levy of all taxing districts in which property certified for exemption is lo-  
16 cated if, upon request of a governing body that has adopted the provisions  
17 of ORS 307.515 to 307.523, the rates of taxation of such taxing districts whose  
18 governing boards agree to the policy of exemption under ORS 307.515 to  
19 307.523, when combined with the rate of taxation of the governing body that  
20 adopts the provisions of ORS 307.515 to 307.523, equal 51 percent or more of  
21 the total combined rate of taxation on the property granted exemption.

22 “(3) A governing body may adopt additional provisions relating to the  
23 exemption granted under ORS 307.515 to 307.523 that do not conflict with the  
24 provisions of ORS 307.515 to 307.523.

25 **“SECTION 4. The amendments to ORS 307.515 by section 2 of this**  
26 **2021 Act apply to housing for which an application is filed under ORS**  
27 **307.515 to 307.523 on or after the effective date of this 2021 Act.**

28 **“SECTION 5.** ORS 307.540 is amended to read:

29 “307.540. As used in ORS 307.540 to 307.548:

30 “(1) ‘Governing body’ means the city or county legislative body having

1 jurisdiction over the property for which an exemption may be applied for  
2 under ORS 307.540 to 307.548.

3 “(2) According to the election of a governing body pursuant to ORS  
4 307.543 (1), ‘low income’ means:

5 “(a) Income at or below 60 percent of the area median income as deter-  
6 mined by the Oregon Housing Stability Council based on information from  
7 the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development; [or]

8 “(b)(A) For the initial year that persons occupy property for which an  
9 application for exemption is filed under ORS 307.545, income at or below 60  
10 percent of the area median income as determined by the Oregon Housing  
11 Stability Council based on information from the United States Department  
12 of Housing and Urban Development; and

13 “(B) For every subsequent consecutive year that the persons occupy the  
14 property, income at or below 80 percent of the area median income as de-  
15 termined by the Oregon Housing Stability Council based on information from  
16 the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development[.]; or

17 **“(c) For housing units on property that is awarded tax credits**  
18 **through the federal Low-Income Housing Tax Credit program and is**  
19 **a qualified low-income housing project meeting the requirements of**  
20 **26 U.S.C. 42(g)(1)(C), income at or below 80 percent of the area median**  
21 **income as determined by the Oregon Housing Stability Council based**  
22 **on information from the United States Department of Housing and**  
23 **Urban Development, provided the average area median income of all**  
24 **housing units on the property is at or below 60 percent of the area**  
25 **median income as determined by the Oregon Housing Stability Council**  
26 **based on information from the United States Department of Housing**  
27 **and Urban Development.**

28 **“SECTION 6. The amendments to ORS 307.540 by section 5 of this**  
29 **2021 Act apply to housing for which an application is filed under ORS**  
30 **307.545 on or after the effective date of this 2021 Act.**

1        **“SECTION 7.** ORS 307.827 is amended to read:

2        “307.827. (1) Environmentally sensitive logging equipment is exempt from  
3 ad valorem property taxation.

4        “(2) As used in this section:

5        “(a) ‘Environmentally sensitive logging equipment’ means logging equip-  
6 ment that was originally manufactured after 1992.

7        “(b) ‘Logging equipment’ means machinery and equipment:

8        “(A) Used **or held for use** in logging or forest management operations  
9 involving timber harvest, including the felling, bucking, yarding, loading or  
10 utilization of timber, logs or wood fiber in the forest, or used **or held for**  
11 **use** in reforestation, forest vegetation restoration, site preparation, vege-  
12 tation control, stand and tree improvement or thinning;

13        “(B) That is specifically designed for activities related to water quality  
14 or fish and wildlife habitat protection in the forest; or

15        “(C) Consisting of excavators used **or held for use** in logging road con-  
16 struction, maintenance, reconstruction or improvements, including the clos-  
17 ing or obliterating of existing forest roads.

18        “(c) ‘Logging equipment’ does not include:

19        “(A) Equipment used in nonforest applications for more than 20 percent  
20 of the tax year, as measured by the operating hours of the equipment.

21        “(B) Equipment used **or held for use** in the manufacturing or milling of  
22 forest products.

23        “(C) Power saws, hand tools, blocks or pulleys that are not a part of the  
24 equipment, rigging, shop equipment or support equipment.

25        “(D) Logging equipment that is exempt from tax under ORS 307.831.

26        **“SECTION 8. The amendments to ORS 307.827 by section 7 of this**  
27 **2021 Act apply to property tax years beginning on or after July 1, 2019.**

28        **“SECTION 9.** ORS 307.651 is amended to read:

29        “307.651. As used in ORS 307.651 to 307.687, unless the context requires  
30 otherwise:

1 “(1) ‘Governing body’ means the city legislative body having jurisdiction  
2 over the property for which an exemption may be applied for under ORS  
3 307.651 to 307.687.

4 “(2) ‘Qualified dwelling unit’ means a dwelling unit that, at the time an  
5 application is filed pursuant to ORS 307.667, has a market value for the land  
6 and improvements of no more than 120 percent, or a lesser percentage as  
7 adopted by the governing body by resolution, of the median sales price of  
8 dwelling units located within the city.

9 “(3) ‘Single-unit housing’ means a structure having one or more dwelling  
10 units that:

11 “(a) Is, or will be, upon purchase, rehabilitation or completion of con-  
12 struction, in conformance with all local plans and planning regulations, in-  
13 cluding special or district-wide plans developed and adopted pursuant to ORS  
14 chapters 195, 196, 197 and 227.

15 “(b) If newly constructed, is completed within two years after application  
16 for exemption is approved under ORS 307.674 [*or before January 1, 2025,*  
17 *whichever is earlier*].

18 “(c) Is designed for each dwelling unit within the structure to be pur-  
19 chased by and lived in by one person or one family.

20 “(d) Has one or more qualified dwelling units within the single-unit  
21 housing.

22 “(e) Is not a floating home, as defined in ORS 830.700, or a manufactured  
23 structure, other than a manufactured home described in ORS 197.307 (8)(a)  
24 to (f).

25 “(4) ‘Structure’ does not include the land or any site development made  
26 to the land, as those terms are defined in ORS 307.010.

27 **“SECTION 10.** ORS 307.677 is amended to read:

28 “307.677. Notwithstanding ORS 307.651 to 307.687:

29 “(1) If the city finds that construction of single-unit housing was not  
30 completed [*by a date that is 12 months after the date on which applications*

1 *may no longer be approved under ORS 307.674, and]* **in accordance with**  
2 **ORS 307.651 (3)(b), the city may extend the deadline for completion of**  
3 **construction for a period not to exceed an additional 24 consecutive**  
4 **months if the city** further finds that:

5 “(a) The failure to complete construction was due to circumstances be-  
6 yond the control of the owner[, *and that*]; **and**

7 “(b) The owner had been acting and could reasonably be expected to act  
8 in good faith and with due diligence[, *the city may extend the deadline for*  
9 *completion of construction for a period not to exceed an additional 12 consec-*  
10 *utive months*].

11 “(2) If property granted exemption under ORS 307.651 to 307.687 is de-  
12 stroyed by fire or act of God, or is otherwise no longer capable of occupancy  
13 due to circumstances beyond the control of the owner, the exemption shall  
14 cease but no additional taxes or penalty shall be imposed under ORS 307.651  
15 to 307.687 upon the property.

16 “**SECTION 11.** ORS 307.681 is amended to read:

17 “307.681. (1) Except as provided in ORS 307.684, if, after an application  
18 has been approved under ORS 307.674, the city finds [*that construction of*  
19 *single-unit housing was not completed within two years after the date the ap-*  
20 *plication was approved or on or before January 1, 2025, whichever is earlier,*  
21 *or]* that any provision of ORS 307.651 to 307.687 is not being complied with,  
22 or any provision required by the city pursuant to ORS 307.651 to 307.687 is  
23 not being complied with, the city shall give notice to the owner, mailed to  
24 the owner’s last-known address, of the proposed termination of the ex-  
25 emption. The notice shall state the reasons for the proposed termination and  
26 shall require the owner to appear at a specified time, not less than 20 days  
27 after mailing the notice, to show cause, if any, why the exemption should  
28 not be terminated.

29 “(2) If the owner fails to show cause why the exemption should not be  
30 terminated, the city shall adopt an ordinance or resolution stating its

1 findings and terminating the exemption. A copy of the ordinance or resolu-  
2 tion shall be filed with the county assessor and a copy sent to the owner  
3 at the owner's last-known address within 10 days after its adoption.

4 **SECTION 12. The amendments to ORS 307.651, 307.677 and 307.681**  
5 **by sections 9 to 11 of this 2021 Act apply to property for which an ap-**  
6 **plication has been approved under ORS 307.674 before, on or after the**  
7 **effective date of this 2021 Act.**

8 **SECTION 13.** ORS 315.514 is amended to read:

9 "315.514. (1) A credit against the taxes that are otherwise due under ORS  
10 chapter 316 or, if the taxpayer is a corporation, under ORS chapter 317 or  
11 318, is allowed to a taxpayer for certified film production development con-  
12 tributions made by the taxpayer [*during the tax year*] to the Oregon Pro-  
13 duction Investment Fund established under ORS 284.367.

14 "(2)(a) The Department of Revenue shall, in cooperation with the Oregon  
15 Film and Video Office, conduct an auction of tax credits under this section.  
16 The auction may be conducted no later than April 15 following December 31  
17 of any tax year for which the credit is allowed. The department may conduct  
18 the auction in the manner that it determines is best suited to maximize the  
19 return to the state on the sale of tax credit certifications and shall announce  
20 a reserve bid prior to conducting the auction. The reserve amount shall be  
21 at least 90 percent of the total amount of the tax credit. Moneys necessary  
22 to reimburse the department for the actual costs incurred by the department  
23 in administering an auction, not to exceed 0.25 percent of auction proceeds,  
24 are continuously appropriated to the department. The department shall de-  
25 posit net receipts from the auction required under this section in the Oregon  
26 Production Investment Fund.

27 "(b) The Oregon Film and Video Office shall adopt rules in order to  
28 achieve the following goals:

29 "(A) Subject to paragraph (a) of this subsection, generate contributions  
30 for which tax credits of \$14 million are certified for each fiscal year;

1 “(B) Maximize income and excise tax revenues that are retained by the  
2 State of Oregon for state operations; and

3 “(C) Provide the necessary financial incentives for taxpayers to make  
4 contributions, taking into consideration the impact of granting a credit upon  
5 a taxpayer’s federal income tax liability.

6 “(3) Contributions made under this section shall be deposited in the  
7 Oregon Production Investment Fund.

8 “(4)(a) Upon receipt of a contribution, the Oregon Film and Video Office  
9 shall, except as provided in ORS 315.516, issue to the taxpayer written cer-  
10 tification of the amount certified for tax credit under this section to the  
11 extent the amount certified for tax credit, when added to all amounts previ-  
12 ously certified for tax credit under this section, does not exceed \$14 million  
13 for the fiscal year in which certification is made.

14 “**(b) The Oregon Film and Video Office may issue a certification for**  
15 **a credit under this section, and a credit may be allowed, for the tax**  
16 **year in which a contribution is made, or for the tax year immediately**  
17 **preceding the tax year in which a contribution is made and for auc-**  
18 **tions conducted no later than April 15 following December 31 of any**  
19 **tax year for which the credit is allowed, if no return has yet been filed**  
20 **for the preceding tax year.**

21 “[*b*] (c) The Oregon Film and Video Office and the department are not  
22 liable, and a refund of a contributed amount need not be made, if a taxpayer  
23 who has received tax credit certification is unable to use all or a portion of  
24 the tax credit to offset the tax liability of the taxpayer.

25 “(5) To the extent the Oregon Film and Video Office does not certify  
26 contributed amounts as eligible for a tax credit under this section, the tax-  
27 payer may request a refund of the amount the taxpayer contributed, and the  
28 office shall refund that amount.

29 “(6)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, a tax credit  
30 claimed under this section may not exceed the tax liability of the taxpayer

1 and may not be carried over to another tax year.

2 “(b) Any tax credit otherwise allowable under this section that is not used  
3 by the taxpayer in a particular tax year may be carried forward and offset  
4 against the taxpayer’s tax liability for the next succeeding tax year. Any  
5 credit remaining unused in the next succeeding tax year may be carried  
6 forward and used in the second succeeding tax year, and likewise, any credit  
7 not used in that second succeeding tax year may be carried forward and used  
8 in the third succeeding tax year but may not be carried forward for any tax  
9 year thereafter.

10 “(c) A taxpayer is not eligible for a tax credit under this section if the  
11 first tax year for which the credit would otherwise be allowed begins on or  
12 after January 1, 2024.

13 “(7) If a tax credit is claimed under this section by a nonresident or  
14 part-year resident taxpayer, the amount shall be allowed without proration  
15 under ORS 316.117.

16 “(8) If the amount of contribution for which a tax credit certification is  
17 made is allowed as a deduction for federal tax purposes, the amount of the  
18 contribution shall be added to federal taxable income for Oregon tax pur-  
19 poses.

20 **“SECTION 14.** ORS 315.643 is amended to read:

21 “315.643. (1) A credit against the taxes that are otherwise due under ORS  
22 chapter 316 or, if the taxpayer is a corporation, under ORS chapter 317 or  
23 318, is allowed to a taxpayer for certified Opportunity Grant contributions  
24 made by the taxpayer [*during the tax year*] to the Opportunity Grant Fund  
25 established under ORS 348.266. **A credit is allowed for the tax year in  
26 which a contribution is made, or for the tax year immediately pre-  
27 ceding the tax year in which a contribution is made and for auctions  
28 conducted no later than April 15 following December 31 of any tax year  
29 for which the credit is allowed, if no return has yet been filed for the  
30 preceding tax year.**

1       “(2)(a) The Department of Revenue shall, in cooperation with the Higher  
2 Education Coordinating Commission, conduct an auction of tax credits under  
3 this section. The auction may be conducted no later than April 15 following  
4 December 31 of any tax year for which the credit is allowed. The department  
5 may conduct the auction in the manner that it determines is best suited to  
6 maximize the return to the state on the sale of tax credit certifications and  
7 shall announce a reserve bid prior to conducting the auction. The reserve  
8 amount shall be at least 90 percent of the total amount of the tax credit.  
9 Moneys necessary to reimburse the department for the actual costs incurred  
10 by the department in administering an auction, not to exceed 0.25 percent  
11 of auction proceeds, are continuously appropriated to the department. Mon-  
12 eys necessary to reimburse the commission for the actual costs incurred by  
13 the commission in administering an auction, not to exceed 0.25 percent of  
14 auction proceeds, are continuously appropriated to the commission. The de-  
15 partment shall deposit net receipts from the auction required under this  
16 section in the Opportunity Grant Fund.

17       “(b) The commission may adopt rules necessary for the administration of  
18 the auction.

19       “(3) Contributions made under this section shall be deposited in the Op-  
20 portunity Grant Fund.

21       “(4)(a) Upon receipt of a contribution, the commission shall, except as  
22 provided in ORS 315.646, issue to the taxpayer written certification of the  
23 amount certified for tax credit under this section to the extent the amount  
24 certified for tax credit, when added to all amounts previously certified for  
25 tax credit under this section, does not exceed \$14 million for the fiscal year  
26 in which certification is made.

27       “(b) The commission and the department are not liable, and a refund of  
28 a contributed amount need not be made, if a taxpayer that has received tax  
29 credit certification is unable to use all or a portion of the tax credit to offset  
30 the tax liability of the taxpayer.

1 “(5) To the extent the commission does not certify contributed amounts  
2 as eligible for a tax credit under this section, the taxpayer may request a  
3 refund of the amount the taxpayer contributed, and the commission shall  
4 refund that amount.

5 “(6)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, a tax credit  
6 claimed under this section may not exceed the tax liability of the taxpayer  
7 and may not be carried over to another tax year.

8 “(b) Any tax credit otherwise allowable under this section that is not used  
9 by the taxpayer in a particular tax year may be carried forward and offset  
10 against the taxpayer’s tax liability for the next succeeding tax year. Any  
11 credit remaining unused in the next succeeding tax year may be carried  
12 forward and used in the second succeeding tax year, and likewise, any credit  
13 not used in that second succeeding tax year may be carried forward and used  
14 in the third succeeding tax year but may not be carried forward for any tax  
15 year thereafter.

16 “(c) A taxpayer is not eligible for a tax credit under this section if the  
17 first tax year for which the credit would otherwise be allowed begins on or  
18 after January 1, 2024.

19 “(7) If a tax credit is claimed under this section by a nonresident or  
20 part-year resident taxpayer, the amount shall be allowed without proration  
21 under ORS 316.117.

22 “(8) If the amount of contribution for which a tax credit certification is  
23 made is allowed as a deduction for federal tax purposes, the amount of the  
24 contribution shall be added to federal taxable income for Oregon tax pur-  
25 poses.

26 **“SECTION 15. The amendments to ORS 315.514 and 315.643 by**  
27 **sections 13 and 14 of this 2021 Act apply to tax years beginning on or**  
28 **after January 1, 2019, and before January 1, 2024.**

29 **“SECTION 16. ORS 317.710 is amended to read:**

30 **“317.710. (1) A corporation shall make a return with respect to the tax**

1 imposed by this chapter as provided in this section.

2 “(2) If the corporation is a member of an affiliated group of corporations  
3 making a consolidated federal return, it shall file a return and determine its  
4 Oregon taxable income as provided in ORS 317.715. The corporation’s tax li-  
5 ability shall be joint and several with any other corporation that is included  
6 in a consolidated state return with the corporation under subsection (5) of  
7 this section.

8 “(3) If the corporation makes a separate return for federal income tax  
9 purposes, it shall file a separate return under this chapter. The corporation  
10 shall determine its Oregon taxable income and tax liability separately from  
11 any other corporation.

12 “(4) For purposes of subsection (3) of this section, if the corporation is  
13 not subject to taxation under the Internal Revenue Code a return for federal  
14 income tax purposes includes any form of return required to be made in lieu  
15 of an income tax return under the Internal Revenue Code or regulations  
16 thereunder.

17 “(5)(a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, if two or more cor-  
18 porations subject to taxation under this chapter are members of the same  
19 affiliated group making a consolidated federal return and are members of the  
20 same unitary group, they shall file a consolidated state return.

21 “(b) If any corporation that is a member of an affiliated group is permit-  
22 ted or required to determine its Oregon taxable income on a separate basis  
23 under ORS 314.667, or if any corporation is permitted or required by statute  
24 or rule to use different apportionment factors than a corporation with which  
25 it is affiliated, the corporation may not be included in a consolidated state  
26 return under paragraph (a) of this subsection.

27 “(c) Whenever two or more corporations are required to file a consol-  
28 idated state return under paragraph (a) of this subsection, any reference in  
29 this chapter to a corporation for purposes of deriving Oregon taxable income  
30 shall be treated as a reference to all corporations that are included in the

1 consolidated state return.

2 “(d) A corporation that would not be a member of an affiliated group fil-  
3 ing a consolidated state return based solely on the application of section  
4 [1504(b)(6)] **1504(b)(4)** of the Internal Revenue Code must be included in the  
5 consolidated state return filed by the affiliated group.

6 “(6) If so directed by the department, by rule or instructions on the state  
7 tax return form, every corporation required to make a return under this  
8 chapter shall also file with the return a true copy of the corporation’s federal  
9 income tax return for the same taxable year. For purposes of this subsection,  
10 the corporation’s federal income tax return includes a consolidated federal  
11 return for an affiliated group of which the corporation is a member. The  
12 department may, by rule or instructions, permit a corporation to submit  
13 specified excerpts from its federal return in lieu of submitting a copy of the  
14 entire federal return. The federal return or any part thereof required to be  
15 filed with the state return is incorporated in and shall be a part of the state  
16 return.

17 “(7)(a) Each foreign or alien insurer and each domestic insurer owned and  
18 controlled, directly or indirectly, by one or more foreign insurers:

19 “(A) Shall determine its Oregon taxable income under ORS 317.650 to  
20 317.665;

21 “(B) Shall make a return of the tax imposed by this chapter on a separate  
22 basis; and

23 “(C) May not be included in a consolidated state return.

24 “(b) An interinsurance and reciprocal exchange and its attorney in fact  
25 with respect to its attorney in fact net income as a corporate attorney in fact
