3 **“SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
4 **the amount of \$36,940,110 is established for the biennium beginning**
5 **July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lot-**
6 **tery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic**
7 **Development Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission**
8 **for debt service on lottery bonds sold for the benefit of Oregon public**
9 **universities.**

10 **“SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
11 **the amount of \$13,379,130 is established for the biennium beginning**
12 **July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lot-**
13 **tery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic**
14 **Development Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission**
15 **for debt service on lottery bonds sold for the benefit of Oregon com-**
16 **munity colleges.**

17 **“SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
18 **the amount of \$12,274,716 is established for the biennium beginning**
19 **July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lot-**
20 **tery moneys allocated from the Education Stability Fund to the Higher**
21 **Education Coordinating Commission for Oregon Opportunity Grants.**

22 **“SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
23 **the amount of \$49,418,728 is established for the biennium beginning**
24 **July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lot-**
25 **tery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic**
26 **Development Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission**
27 **to the Outdoor School Education Fund.**

28 **“SECTION 5a. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expendi-**
29 **tures, the amount of \$16,514,607 is established for the biennium begin-**
30 **ning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by**

1 the Higher Education Coordinating Commission from lottery moneys
2 allocated to the Sports Lottery Account.

3 **“SECTION 6.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
4 the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July
5 1, 2021, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees,
6 moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-
7 cluding lottery funds and federal funds and funds described in sections
8 8 to 12 of this 2021 Act, collected or received by the Higher Education
9 Coordinating Commission, for the following purposes:

- 10 (1) Higher Education Coordinating
11 Commission programs and
12 related grants \$ 77,211,231
- 13 (2) Debt service on outstanding
14 general obligation bonds sold
15 for the benefit of Oregon
16 Health and Science University.. \$ 30,869,380
- 17 (3) Debt service on outstanding
18 lottery bonds and general
19 obligation bonds sold for
20 the benefit of Oregon public
21 universities \$ 4,101,340

22 **“SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
23 the amount of \$130,656,715 is established for the biennium beginning
24 July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fed-
25 eral funds, excluding federal funds described in section 10 of this 2021
26 Act, collected or received by the Higher Education Coordinating Com-
27 mission, for Higher Education Coordinating Commission programs and
28 related grants.

29 **“SECTION 8.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
30 the amount of \$70,563 is established for the biennium beginning July

1 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Higher
2 Education Coordinating Commission from the moneys received from
3 the Western Oregon Timber Severance Tax Fund and the Eastern
4 Oregon Timber Severance Tax Fund for the Community College Sup-
5 port Fund.

6 “SECTION 9. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, expenditures
7 by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for debt service on
8 general obligation bonds and certificates of participation issued for the
9 benefit of public universities and Oregon Health and Science Univer-
10 sity and paid with resources received from the public universities and
11 Oregon Health and Science University are not limited.

12 “SECTION 10. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, expendi-
13 tures by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for payments
14 to individuals, organizations or units of government from federal Na-
15 tional Emergency Grants funds are not limited.

16 “SECTION 11. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, expendi-
17 tures by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for debt ser-
18 vice on Build America Bonds sold for the benefit of public universities
19 and community colleges are not limited.

20 “SECTION 12. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, expendi-
21 tures by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission of moneys
22 from the Tuition Protection Fund are not limited.

23 “SECTION 13. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate
24 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
25 declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect July 1, 2021.”

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
