PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 5011

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 27 and delete page 2 2 and insert:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> There is appropriated to the Housing and Community
 Services Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of
 the General Fund, the amount of \$153,793,142.

"SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, 6 the amount of \$353,390,232 is established for the biennium beginning 7 July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses for oper-8 ations, from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous 9 Receipts and federal funds from the United States Department of 10 Housing and Urban Development for contract services, but excluding 11 lottery funds and federal funds not described in this section, collected 12 or received by the Housing and Community Services Department. 13

14 "SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, 15 the amount of \$30,269,740 is established for the biennium beginning 16 July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lot-17 tery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic 18 Development Fund to the Housing and Community Services Depart-19 ment for lottery bonds.

20 "<u>SECTION 4.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, 21 the amount of \$437,717,346 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds other than those described in sections 2 and 6 of this 2021 Act collected or received by the Housing and Community Services Department.

"<u>SECTION 5.</u> There is appropriated to the Housing and Community
Services Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of
the General Fund, the amount of \$50,273,038 for debt service for bondrelated activities.

"SECTION 6. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, 9 the amount of \$1 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, 10 as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or 11 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds 12 from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Develop-13 ment for contract services, but excluding lottery funds and federal 14 funds not described in this section, collected or received by the Hous-15ing and Community Services Department, for debt service and related 16 costs for outstanding general obligation bonds sold pursuant to Article 17 **XI-Q** of the Oregon Constitution. 18

"SECTION 7. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, expenditures
 by the Housing and Community Services Department for the following
 are not limited:

"(1) Payments for costs resulting from the sale and issuance or redemption of bonds issued under ORS 287A.360, 456.519, 456.645 and
456.650 (2005 Edition).

"(2) Payment of debt service and redemption premium on bonds is sued under ORS 287A.360, 456.519, 456.645 and 456.650 (2005 Edition) and
 payments for the purchase of bonds as provided in ORS 456.680.

"(3) Loans and payments for purchasing, insuring and servicing
 loans as provided in ORS 456.625, 456.627, 456.635, 456.690, 456.705, 456.715
 and 456.717 and payments for the purchase from lending institutions

of securities backed by residential loans as provided in ORS 456.635 (1).
 "(4) Advances for development costs made in accordance with ORS
 456.710.

"(5) Pass-through payments of federal rent subsidy moneys from
the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.

6 "(6) Payments for costs associated with asset protection.

"SECTION 8. (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Emergency Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$10,000,000 to be allocated to the Housing and Community Services Department for development of affordable rental housing projects that are colocated with child care or early learning centers.

"(2) If any of the moneys appropriated by subsection (1) of this
 section are not allocated by the Emergency Board prior to December
 1, 2022, the moneys remaining on that date become available for any
 purpose for which the Emergency Board lawfully may allocate funds.

"SECTION 9. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect July 1, 2021.".

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
