20 **Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for expenditures of pro-**
21 **ceeds from state bonds issued for the benefit of a public university,**
22 **pursuant to agreements between the commission and a public univer-**
23 **sity.**

24 **“SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**

3 **“SECTION 5. The project approvals and expenditure limitations in**

21 ginning July 1, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from
22 fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-
23 cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Higher
24 Education Coordinating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds from state
25 bonds issued for the benefit of a community college, pursuant to agreements
26 between the commission and a community college.

27 **“SECTION 9.** Section 4, chapter 747, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to
28 read:

29 **“Sec. 4.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the
30 amount of [~~\$101,397,241~~] **\$72,400,247** is established for a six-year period be-

1 ginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from
2 fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and re-
3 imbursements from federal service agreements, but excluding lottery funds
4 and federal funds not described in this section, collected or received by the
5 Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds
6 from state bonds issued for the benefit of a community college, pursuant to
7 agreements between the commission and a community college.

8 **“SECTION 10. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
9 **and in lieu of the limitation on expenditures established at the De-**
10 **cember 14, 2018, Emergency Board meeting (Item No. 25), as increased**
11 **at the September 25, 2020, Emergency Board meeting (Item No. 33), the**
12 **amount of \$25,000,000 is established for a six-year period beginning July**
13 **1, 2017, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses for the Camp**
14 **Umatilla Regional Training Institute Re-Set project from federal funds**
15 **collected or received by the Oregon Military Department.**

16 **“SECTION 11. The Legislative Assembly approves the proposal of**
17 **the Oregon Military Department, submitted in accordance with ORS**
18 **396.515 (4), for the sale of the Lebanon Armory and Lebanon Organ-**
19 **izational Maintenance Shop.**

20 **“SECTION 12. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate**
21 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
22 **declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect July 1, 2021.”.**

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
