## **Re: Oregon Wine Council Supports SB 317**

Dear Chair Riley and members of the committee,

The Oregon Wine Council (OWC) is a statewide advocacy association, and our members represent over fifty percent of the Oregon wine grapes grown, produced and sold. OWC is committed to ensuring the long-term stability of Oregon's wine industry and providing support for every winery and wine business in our state, large and small. We write today to share our support for SB 317 and the -1 amendment, which would create parity for single servings of wine under this cocktails-to-go concept.

Recognizing the impact that the pandemic and consequent shutdowns put on our state's restaurants and bars, the Oregon Legislature took action to provide relief to these struggling businesses during the Third Special Session in December. The passage of SB 1801, which has temporarily allowed on-premise sales licensees to sell sealed, single servings of wine, mixed wine or spirits for off-premise consumption was a step in the right direction. Unfortunately, relief is still needed.

The economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic are pronounced, and many businesses will struggle to recover for the next several years. Yet no industry was hit harder over the last year by the pandemic and the September wildfires than Oregon's food and beverage industry, particularly the wine industry. SB 317 and its -1 amendment are a small step towards supporting the recovery of these industries. This bill and the -1 amendment will allow restaurants to sell single serve glasses of wine, cocktails and mixed wine drinks like mimosas or sangrias. The inclusion of the -1 amendment is critical for our wineries who have not only lost sales to local restaurants and bars, but to consumers who would, in normal circumstances, purchase from their tasting rooms.

The OWC respectfully urges the committee to adopt the -1 amendments and pass SB 317 and provide needed support for Oregon's wine and hospitality industries.
