As a national leader in supported employment for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD), the state of Oregon has done a stellar job advocating and supporting community integrated employment for this important community. Since the adoption of its Employment First policy in 2008, Oregon has transformed its provider system and facilitated the transition of more than a thousand workers from sheltered employment to jobs with Oregon companies. ORA's members are proud of the support they have played in this effort.

However, as employers, Oregon state agencies still lag behind private industry when it comes to employing people with I/DD. The task force enacted by HB 2151 will be a good first step in exploring how to best level out this discrepancy. More importantly, it will help ensure that the state lives up to and models the ideals set forth in Employment First.
