

SB223

I strongly oppose SB 223. Rather than work to listen to parents who are displeased with what public schools are offering and make changes, some seek to destroy school choice.

When school choice/private schools are threatened by certain persons they reveal quite clearly where their allegiance lies: with government unions, good 'ol boys clubs, self-interest, power and money.
