I hereby submit my support for HB 3112, or Cannabis Equity Act.

With help from diverse voices, the cannabis industry can and will square the benefits of legalization with the consequences of historical criminalization. Oregon's Cannabis Equity Act is the highest and best use of the legislative process as a means of addressing the aftermath of marijuana prosecutions against the backdrop of a burgeoning billion-dollar legal cannabis industry.
