Re: <u>SB 52</u> – Investing in the Success of Our LGBTQ2SIA+ Students – Support

As you can see, many League "Positions" speak to our fundamental belief that <u>SB 52</u> – Investing in the Success of Our LGBTQ2SIA+ Students is good for Oregon, necessary to provide safety and minimize hate crimes and bullying against students of all ages. The League of Women Voters supports equal rights for all under state and federal law regardless of race, color, gender, religion, national origin, age, sexual orientation, or disability. LWV works to secure equal rights and equal opportunity for all, promoting social and economic justice, and the health and safety of all Americans. The League of Women Voters believes every person should have access to free public education that provides equal opportunity for all; and no person or group should suffer legal, economic, or administrative discrimination. Additionally, the LWVOR believes that the early years of a child's life are crucial in building the foundation for educational attainment and greatly impact success or failure in later life. Early intervention and prevention measures are effective in helping children reach their full potential.
