I know I'm the cause for the pain we all feel, then I can forgive myself. This doesn't forgive me, then I will never forget, but it will help me remember so I don't ever make the same mistakes again. I pray someday for the victim and my family can forgive me, not for me but for themselves. No one should have to carry that kind of burden all their lives.

Well, I'm a first time offender at E.O.C.I. who has been incarcerated since 2013 and set to be released into society in 2028. Before my arrest and conviction I had never been in trouble. That's why I write 29 Sentences asking to consider BillSB#91 which gives a Sentence Reduction for AIC's for good behavior that we've charged with measure II crimes, some thing non-measured AIC's currently receive. Those letters weren't us personal as this letter, but I felt better than those involved in the process telling all my story. While at E.O.C.I. I have worked to better myself, working at a job that will provide additional skills upon my release. I stay clear of trouble which is difficult in here to do, but I do. I continue to pray and have faith and hope that if BillSB#91 passes I can see my family sooner rather than later so I can make amends for what I had done. I know one person but I had to try. isn't necessarily going to change your mind, but I had to try.

There are several AIC's in here with similar stories. This isn't just about me so I would like to pray for all parties involved. So in conclusion I'm not asking you to just release AIC's, I'm asking you to bring back good time (Seventeen Redchorn), something I had existed through DOC Prudential in the state of Oregon. When all AIC's were in the eligible for good time by exhibiting good behavior to receive as an incentive. A second chance not to forget but to forgive and have compassion. All words in the Bible.
