I know everyone's crimes has circumstances but almost 6 years for his crime is outrageous. He just turned 28 years old. He's creative, smart, funny and full of life. Also a very talented artist and he's lost most of his 20's to the system.

Without the reform he has a little over two years left. He will be half way to 31 when he's out, but with the reform he could be out much sooner. His time currently served has shown him life is short and you can't get that time back. He has dreams and goals and ambitions and wants a family and to succeed in life, →

getting out early has given him a new hope and light in his eyes. School, career, family, etc.

A lot of men who serve MII are hopeless they don't want to do good because they see it as no point. With this reform they have new hope and reasons to reform themselves.

In a lot of cases the "time does not fit the crime" is so true.

In the case of my boyfriend he has a great support system that misses him dearly and have missed out on him for 4 years already on something that should of never seen this amount of time in the first place with no chance of reduction!

Reform MII, Reform the lives of many people, not only Adults in Custody in Oregon.
