It is shameful that the Legislative Assembly gives \$10,000,000 to immigration legal, defense, universal navigation and services. Although the Legislative Assembly only allocated \$5,000,001 ... provide grants, loans and technical assistance... programs and services that assist with homeownership, including counseling, financial literacy, post-purchase counseling and down payment assistance.... Lastly ...\$600,000 employment and workforce development for refugees....

Therefore, I strongly oppose HB 3230, immigration services and courts are a federal program, not State, thereby the Oregon Legislators should not be giving state revenue to support the federal judiciary.
