

TESTIMONY – SB 541 – Policy on Greenhouse Gas Sequestration Senate Committee on Energy and Environment March 30, 2021

Chair Beyer and Members of the Committee,

My name is Tom Sharp. I reside in Burns, Oregon and currently serve as the President of the Oregon Cattlemen's Association (OCA). Representing one of Oregon's largest agricultural sectors, the Oregon Cattlemen's Association (OCA) encompasses members across the state with cattle and calves in every one of Oregon's 36 counties. OCA submits this testimony in support of SB 541.

A tremendous amount of science, planning, project effort, landowner stewardship, and budget expenditure are invested in natural resource management efforts to achieve healthy land and water ecosystems and for the restoration of degraded conditions amongst Oregon's forests, grasslands, rangelands, and waters. These efforts provide significant contributing benefit and should be accounted for when determining progress towards the state's greenhouse gas emission reduction goals, carbon sequestration, and atmospheric carbon emission reduction.
