-1	Delivery licenses clarification	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Grandfather in existing delivery license-holders to delivery part of equity license. (To prevent conflict with Rep Helm’s bill HB 2519) • Ensure existing retail licensees holding a delivery permit can still deliver within their jurisdiction <p>Other clarifications</p>
-2	Expungement fix	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure that “child endangerment” pieces are narrow (only related solely to cannabis) • Amendments suggested by OJD and OPDS to make this part more workable • Clarify Equity Board role in expanding program in the future
-3	Equity license length; eligibility and clarifications	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make equity licenses last six years (currently 10), but give Equity Board ability to extend to 10 • Clarifications to eligibility (“income” should be HH income) and which licenses get fee reductions • Section 16(1)(b)(B) “additional groups” can be determined based on “impact and disruption,” not just arrest rates <p>Other items in here, mostly cleanup</p>
-4	Trooper cannabis tax dollars	Current draft of bill takes OSP’s portion of tax dollars and puts it in the cannabis fund. This would leave that money in OSP but direct it to be used for expungement work in the bill
-5	Preamble	“Whereas” clauses to establish intent, draft found here
-6	Clarify tax dollars	Fix-it amendment. LRO interpreted the language in the bill to be taking 25% off the top of the Marijuana Account, clarifying that it is 25% cannabis dollars pre-allocation
-8	On-site consumption compromise, NO edibles	For on-site licenses, <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • no smoking allowed indoors—only in outdoor locations out of public view (“smoking porches”) • No consumption of edibles (concerns from LOC/law enforcement)
-9	Change operative date	Change operative date for equity licenses--OLCC to start issuing licenses from August 2022 to March 2022
-11	Equity Investment Board update	Skinnying down the EIB, placing it within the Governor’s DEI office with the Advocacy Commissions, clarifying role of oversight of cannabis dollars in OSP and Ed dollars
