My name is Dr. Reginald Richardson, and I am the president of the Salem-Keizer NAACP. I am writing in support of House Bill 2168 to establish Juneteenth as a legal state holiday.

Juncteenth is an incredibly important holiday with great significance in the history of our country. For our Black communities, the significance of Juncteenth is on par with America's Independence Day. Also known as Freedom Day or Liberation Day, Juncteenth celebrates the final emancipation of slaves in Texas who finally learned that slavery had already been outlawed almost two and a half years earlier. More than 150 years later, Juncteenth continues to be a joyful day of celebrating history. culture, stories, and food among Black communities nationwide.

Establishing Juneteenth as a state holiday in Oregon would be an important step away from our state's shameful history related to Black people, and toward a place that is more diverse, equitable, and inclusive.
