House Committee on Revenue Re: Support for HB 2008A

Chair and committee members, I appreciate the opportunity to support HB 2008 with amendments. I'm Mari Anne Gest representing Church at the Park (C@P) which is a non-profit organization serving unsheltered individuals and families since 2007 in the Salem area.

C@P seeks the mutual transformation of unsheltered people, our staff, and our volunteers through relationships, agency partnerships, and tangible resources. The 20/20 Point in Time Count for Oregon indicated that 61 percent of people experiencing homelessness are unsheltered in places not meant for human habitation. Additionally, the Mid-Willamette Valley Homeless Alliance conducted a Service Gap Analysis in July of 2020 publishing that, "culturally-specific and low-barrier shelters were identified to be most urgent, specifically for women, youth, families, and non-sobriety required eligibility."

Recognizing the dire need for safe shelter options, C@P has expanded services to include outreach, navigation, and low-barrier shelter options of all types. We are located directly adjacent to Salem's Gateway park, where many unhoused individuals are camping. C@P was recently awarded funding to expand the day center to services to 20 hours a week, serving meals, providing laundry services, showers, mail service, and case management.

HB 2008A creates more options and incentives to serve the unsheltered. We appreciate your support.
